Legislature Back to Work Today

Bonding and Stadium Bills Taking Center Stage

Both bodies of the Minnesota Legislature are back in session today. With the governor's veto of the House GOP Tax Bill last Friday morning, significant progress in negotiations toward an overall package will have to be made this week to avoid the 2012 legislative session ending in a stalemate.

Rumors of adjournment on Monday (today) seem to be fading with talk of more hearings yet this week, but this is still probably the last week of the Legislative Session. After today, the Legislature only has three more legislative days left until they reach their constitutional maximum. After that, the governor would have to call a Special Session, which is unlikely.

Also still in play is the passage of a bonding bill and the stadium bill.

The \$1 billion Vikings stadium package is finally making an appearance in the Minnesota House, with leaders planning the debate, which could go on for hours, and vote for later today. If passed in the House, the stadium proposal still faces a Senate vote that would follow on a separate version of the bill. If that version of the bill makes it through the Senate, the varying bills would then have to be reconciled in a conference committee before final votes in both chambers.

Before the House takes up the Vikings stadium bill later today, lawmakers are expected cast their votes on the latest-proposed bonding bill for \$496 million in infrastructure and bridge projects. Because the bill does not contain any local projects, such as the regional ball park, funding for the Southwest Corridor and adequate funding for Capitol restoration, it is unclear whether there are the required 2/3 votes of the body to pass. MAGIC Update

AMC staff continues to work with Rep. McFarlane and House members to find a path forward for MAGIC. At this time, there are no hearings or votes scheduled, but we will alert members if the bill starts moving again.

Governor Signs Environment Omnibus Bill

Gov. Mark Dayton signed the Environment Omnibus Bill (<u>HF2164 - Chapter 272</u>) into law last Thursday. AMC staff is currently working on a detailed summary of the bill for the AMC legislative session summary. Items of particular interest to counties in the bill are the SSTS statute changes that were supported by AMC and the Pollution Control Agency (PCA), as well as the language that is based on the work of the Local Government Water Roundtable which will allow water plans to begin to allow more streamlining of the current water planning process for Soil and Water Conservation Districts, Watershed Districts and counties.

Governor Issues Executive Order Re: No Net Loss of Wetlands

The governor also issued an Executive Order (12-04) to clarify the states stance on no net loss of wetlands that calls for BWSR, PCA, MnDOT, and the Department of Ag to meet with stakeholders to by December 15, 2012, to discuss how to maintain no net loss of wetlands in the state under the Wetland Conservation Act (WCA). The study will assess potential changes to current policies that will improve wetland conservation in Minnesota. It will also evaluate and develop recommendations to improve current wetland protection, restoration and mitigation provisions regarding de minimis exemption allowances and flexibility options, alignment of pre-settlement wetland zones on watershed boundaries. It will evaluate review, approval and implementation for projects subject to wetland replacement requirements and determine the adequacy of funding for wetland banking sites. The study will further develop recommendations to provide for continued restoration of drained wetlands using various funding sources and identify opportunities to improve coordination of wetland regulatory efforts between state and federal agencies.

Governor Vetoes Tax Bill

As expected, Gov. Dayton vetoed the Legislature's omnibus tax bill Friday morning. The bill, which GOP legislative leaders called their "top priority" of the session, would have froze the statewide business property tax levy, improved the tax exemption for business capital expenditures, expanded the "angel investor" tax credit, and provided additional relief to homeowners who saw significant property tax increases in 2012.

Throughout negotiations with legislative leadership, Gov. Dayton made it clear that he opposed any tax cut proposals that would have tapped the state's newly-replenished reserves or increased future deficits. In response to those concerns, GOP leaders significantly reduced their proposed tax cuts, dropping a major provision that would have begun the phase-out of the statewide business property tax. However, even in its modified form, Minnesota Management and Budget estimated that the legislature's tax bill would have used over \$40 million from the state's current budget reserves, and added roughly \$145 million to the projected \$1.1 billion deficit in FY2014-15. Dayton specifically citied those fiscal implications in his veto letter. Republicans argued that their business tax breaks would have spurred enough increased economic activity to offset at least some of those projected revenue losses.

The vetoed bill also included several provisions of note to counties, including important technical fixes to the Homestead Market Value Exclusion, as well as a new, unfunded budget reporting mandate opposed by AMC, MICA, and the League of Minnesota Cities.

The remaining question is whether the Governor and legislative leadership will continue to negotiate on a second omnibus tax bill, or whether the two sides find themselves too far apart to work out a deal. Gov. Dayton has suggested closing tax "loopholes" for Foreign Operating Corporations, or expanding the sales tax to online-only retailers, as potential ways to fund tax relief, though both suggestions face significant roadblocks in the Legislature. Dayton did say Friday that he may be willing to negotiate on a bill that might increase future deficits, though not as much as the \$145 million proposed by the GOP. Republicans, however, held their own press conference later in the day and said that Dayton "burned what may have been the last bridge to working cooperatively with legislators at the Capitol" with his veto.

The legislature does have several "vehicle" bills ready on the House and Senate floors, in case a deal on an alternative tax proposal is reached in the waning days of session. (HF 2337)

Legislature Approves Pension Bill

The Minnesota House has approved an omnibus pension bill that would lower the investment return assumption for the state's major statewide retirement plans. The bill was approved by the Senate in April, and now goes to the governor for signature.

The bill, which was the product of months of work by the bipartisan Commission on Pensions and Retirement, would replace the current 8.5 percent interest rate assumption with a "select-and-ultimate" system, which would drop the assumption to 8.0 percent for five years. During that "select period," study would continue on what an appropriate long-term investment assumption rate should be and whether a return to 8.5 percent is advisable. Governor Signs Bill Making Certain Employee Settlement Details Public

Gov. Dayton has signed a bill that would change the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act to classify as public the contents of local government employee dispute settlement agreements, and the complete details of buy-outs and lump sum payments above \$10,000. The bill, which passed with unanimous support in the House and Senate, was drafted in response to the recent frustration over the lack of details made public in the Burnsville school district's \$250,000 buyout of a former employee.

The new provision would only apply to highly compensated officials (those designated in <u>471.701</u>), chief administrators, and employees in management capacities. Data relating to a complaint or charge against an employee would only be classified as public if the complaint or charge results in disciplinary action, or if the employee resigns or is terminated while the charge is pending. The new law also provides that it does not authorize the release of data that is specifically "not public" under current law. (<u>Chapter 280</u>)

State Issues

All of the bills that AMC has been tracking – those with direct impacts to counties – have been completed for the year. A few HHS bills continue to move through the process.

Newborn Screening: The omnibus data practices bill (SF 1212) now provides a one year technical fix for MDH related to the collection, dissemination and storage of genetic information (primarily blood samples). The language was necessary as a result of court action this year regarding the newborn screening program. This language will require MDH to return to the legislature for a more permanent solution next year. It is unclear yet if this legislation has any direct impact to counties. The bill passed the House last week and now heads to the Senate floor.

Child Custody Disputes: <u>HF 322</u> would change current law to a presumption of joint legal and joint physical custody for both parents. There are differences between the House and Senate bills. There is a concern that this may increase court costs, but counties do not have a position on this legislation.

Health Insurance Exchange Alternative: <u>HF 8</u> was vetoed by Gov. Dayton. This legislation, which would have allowed the creation of "personal health accounts" for use by uninsured individuals, was presented as an alternative to a health care exchange by Sen. Hann and Rep. Gottwalt. In his veto message, the governor continued to express support for a state health care exchange.

Federal Issues

Last Friday the House passed H.R. 4628, the "Interest Rate Reduction Act of 2012", which would repeal the Prevention and Public Health Fund (PPHF) and use nearly \$6 billion to offset a scheduled increase in student loan interest rates for one year. The PPHF funds several public health programs, including the Community Transformation Grants and Section 317 Immunization funding. The Senate will take up the same bill this week,

but it currently uses a different funding source. Senator Franken is already on record opposing the use of the PPHF for this purpose. The Local Public Health Association weighed in against the reduction in the PPHF last week.

Governor Signs Omnibus Game & Fish Bill Including Requirement for Publicly Funded Shooting Ranges

The governor signed the Omnibus Game & Fish Bill (<u>HF 2171</u>), which included the provision requiring publicly funded shooting ranges to be made available to the public. The final version of the provision applies only in the seven-county metro, exempts ranges that are in buildings connected to jails or detention facilities, and only requires ranges to be open four times per year.

Veto Override Attempt for Fireworks Bill

The bill that would allow for the sale of Class C fireworks in Minnesota was vetoed by the governor last week. The Senate attempted a veto override last Monday, which failed on a 37-29 vote. A veto override requires 2/3 of the body (or 45 members) to vote in favor of the motion.

Transportation Policy Omnibus Bill

The conference committee for the Transportation Policy Omnibus Bill, <u>HF 2685</u> (Beard), met this Saturday. The conference committee report includes provisions from both the 2011 Omnibus Policy Bill and the 2012 bill. The final bill includes the language for the County Transportation Streamlining Bill, the creation of a motorcycle road guard certificate, and the increase of the first haul radius for timber and raw agricultural product haulers from 50 miles to 100 miles. Not included in the bill is the expansion of overweight permit to the category of "farm supplies", the contingent appropriations authorization for trunk highway projects, requirement for one license plate rather than two, a local government penalty prohibition on fuel sale, and the expansion authority to the opt-out transit providers. The conference committee report may be taken up for final passage today.

Bonding Bill

A new bonding bill proposal was released last week as a delete-all amendment to <u>HF 1752</u> (Howes). It is rumored that there is House/Senate/Gubernatorial agreement to this proposal. The bill includes:

- \$10M for Local Roads
- \$30M for Local Bridges
- \$8M for Greater Minnesota Transit
- \$2M for Railroad Warning Devices
- \$1M for Port Development Assistance
- \$6M for the BWSR Wetland Replacement Program
- \$3.875M for the Transportation Economic Development Program
- \$44M for the Capitol Restoration Project
- \$0 for Southwest Corridor

Following Chair David's visit up north last year, I have continued to bring that request to their attention since it was a problem raised in both counties.

Here's how the situation stands as of today:

Chair Davids is proposing a total repeal of the tax, phased out over several years. If the governor vetoes that bill, the next step will be to attempt to change the collection procedure.
