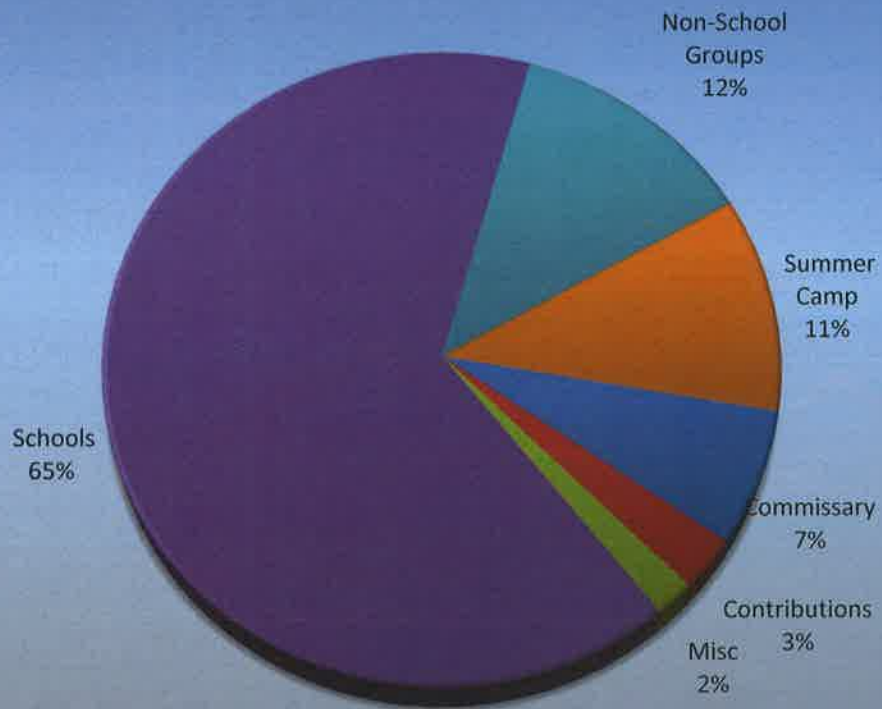

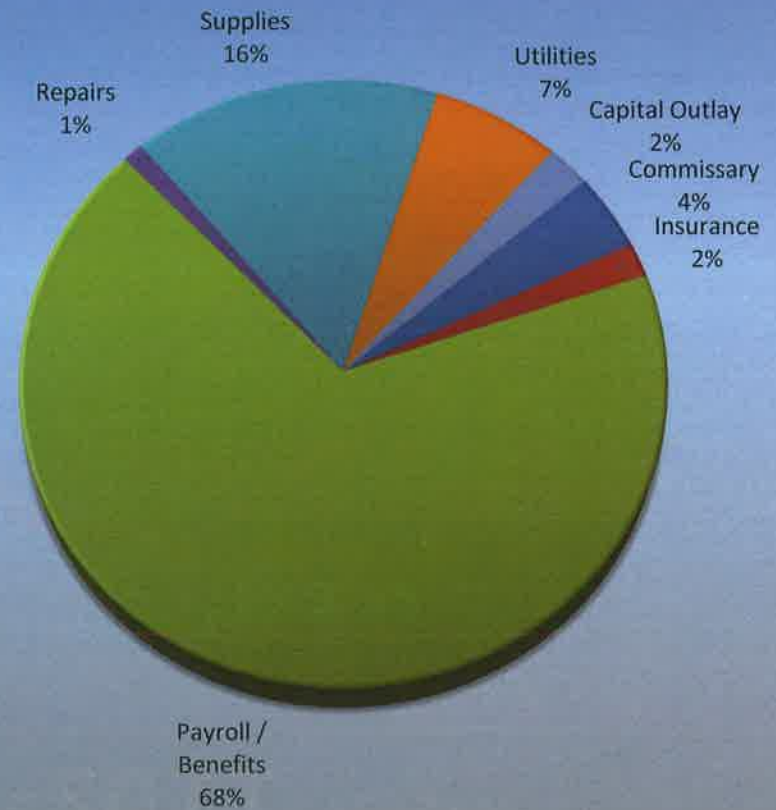

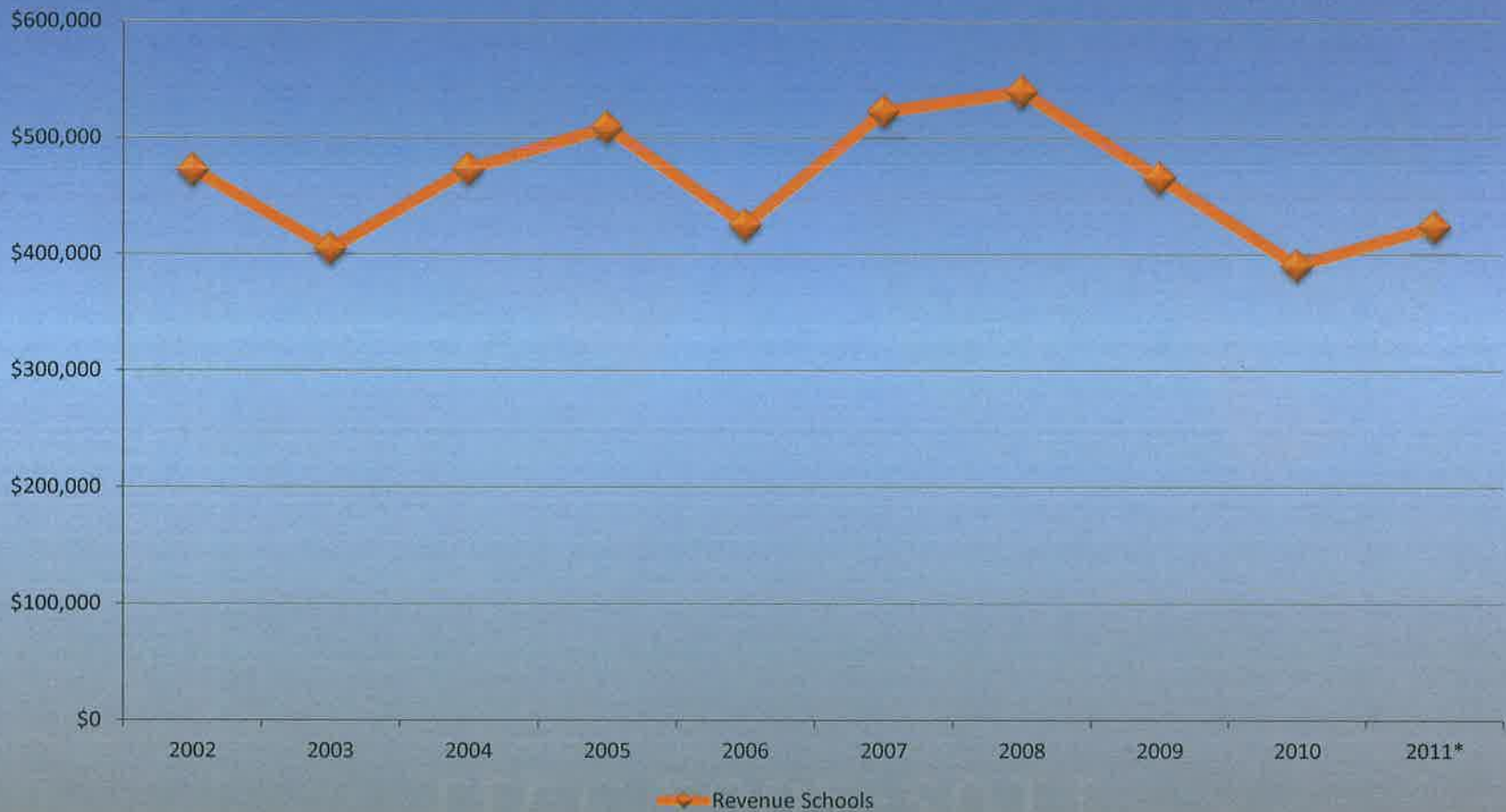
## Operational Revenue



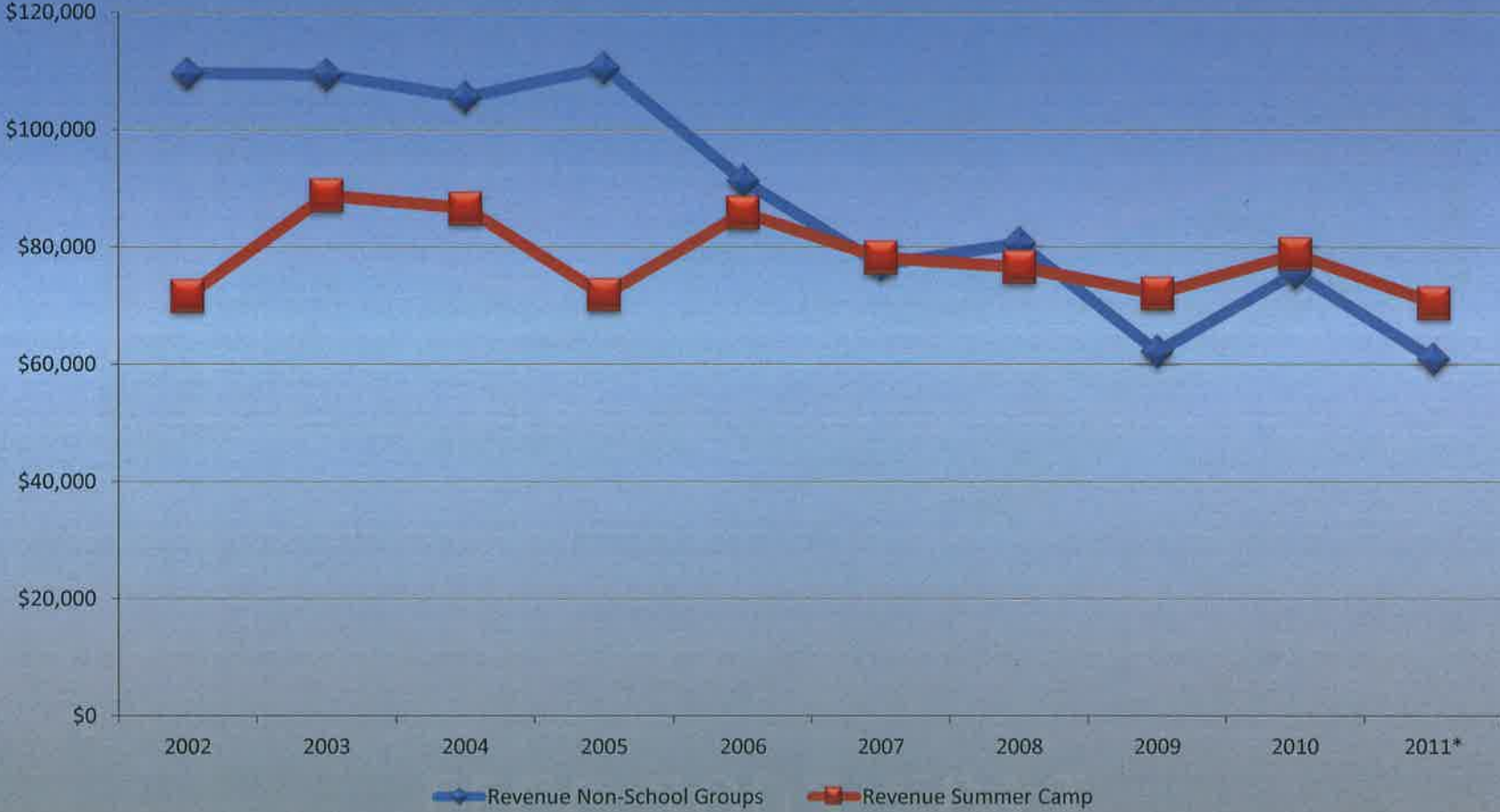
## Operational Expenses



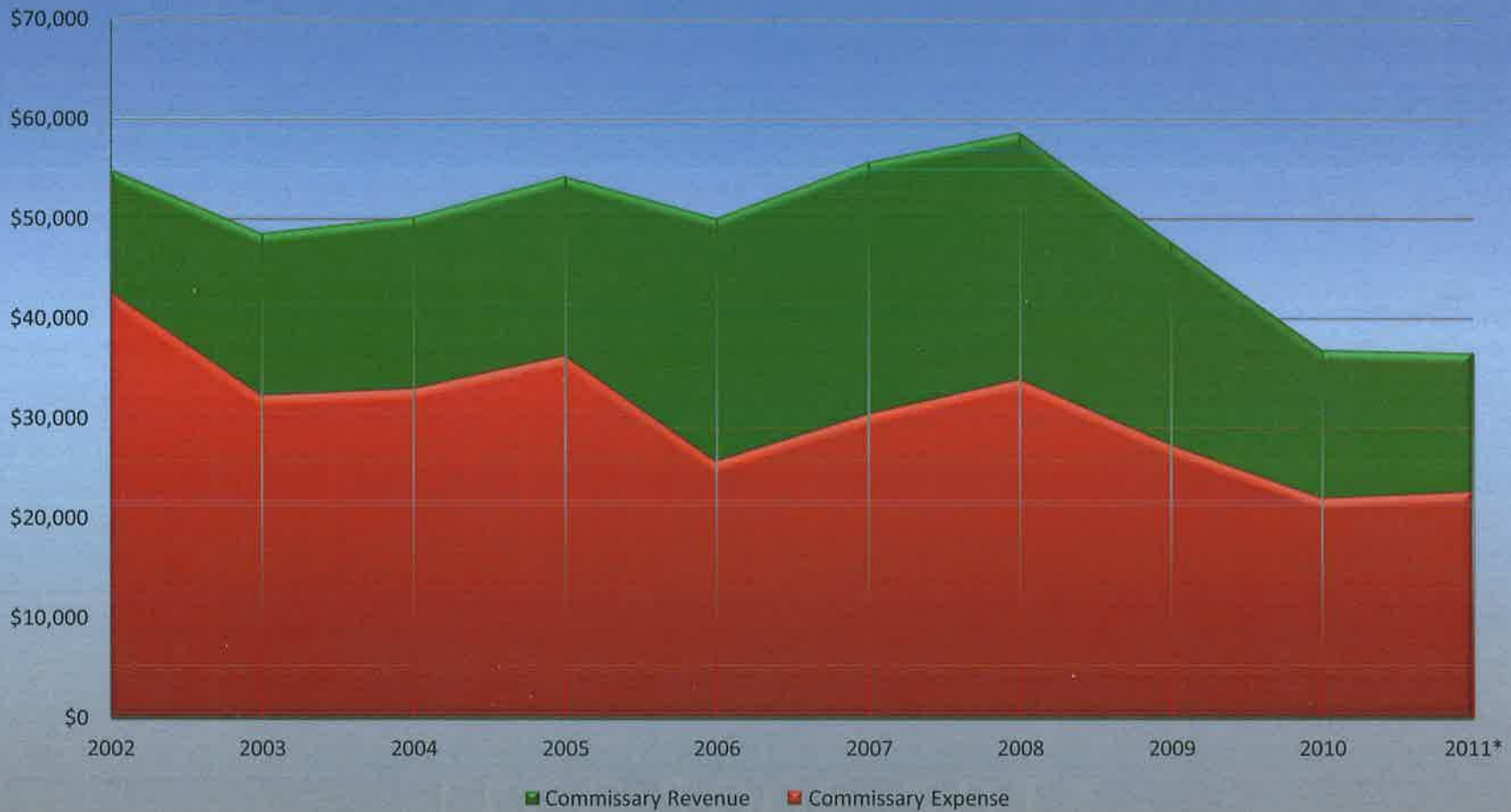

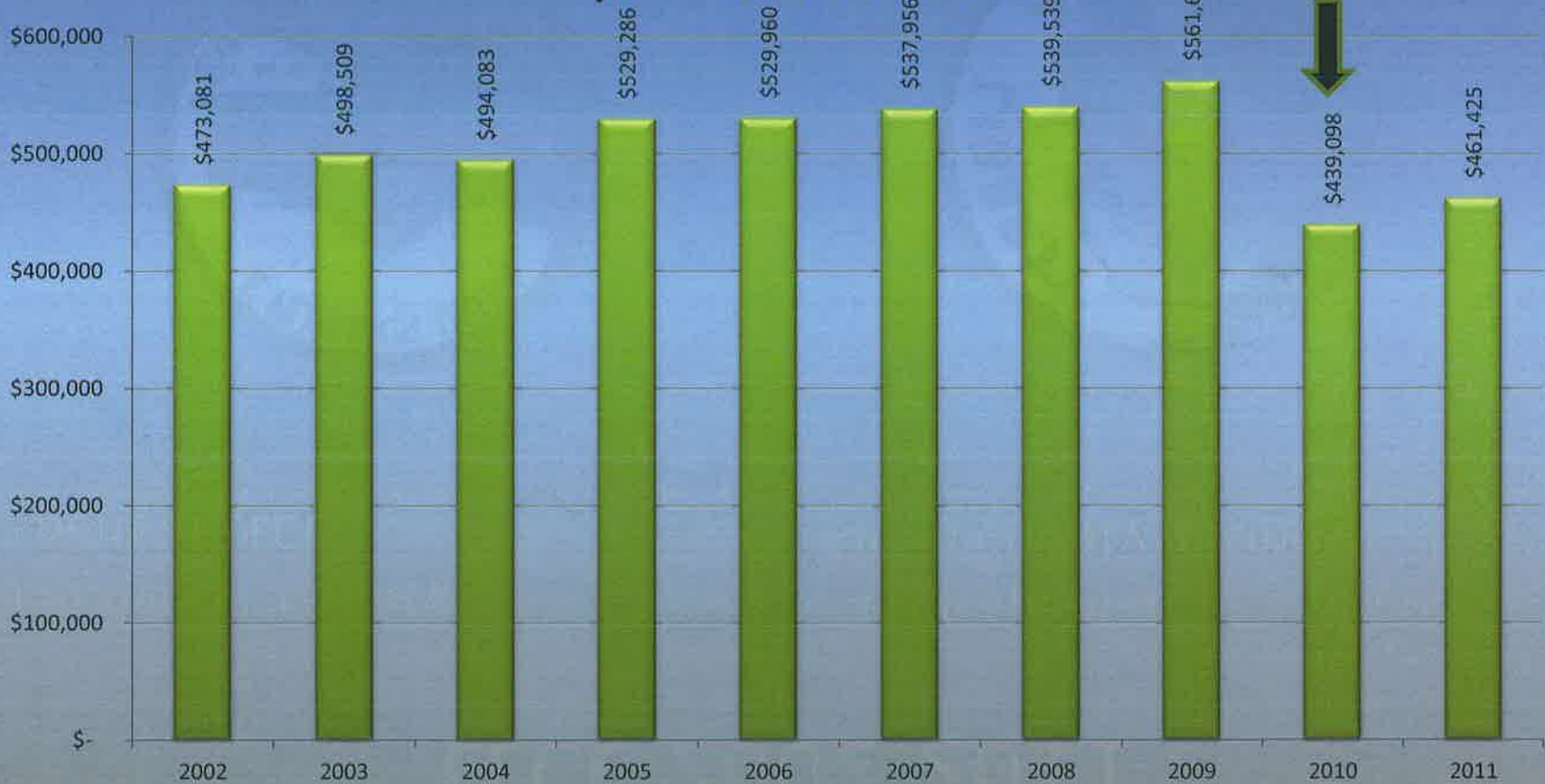

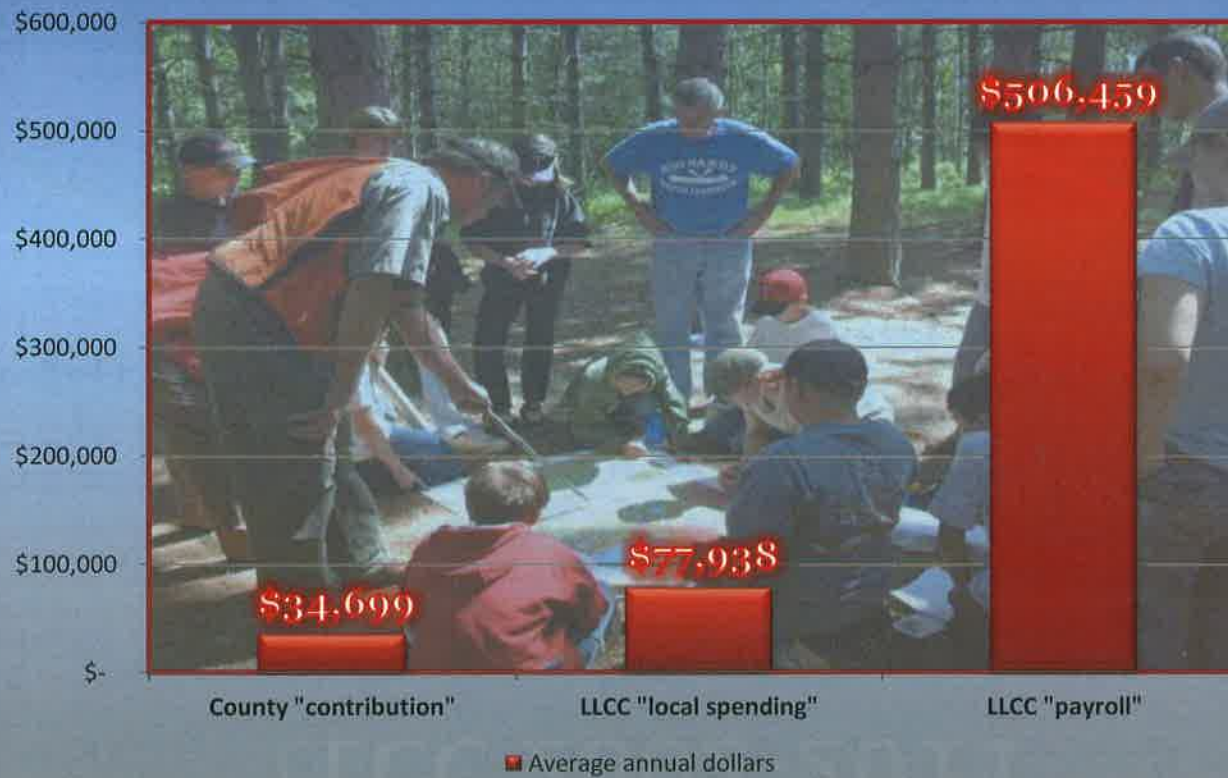
Payroll & associated costs

## Average Annual LLCC related spending



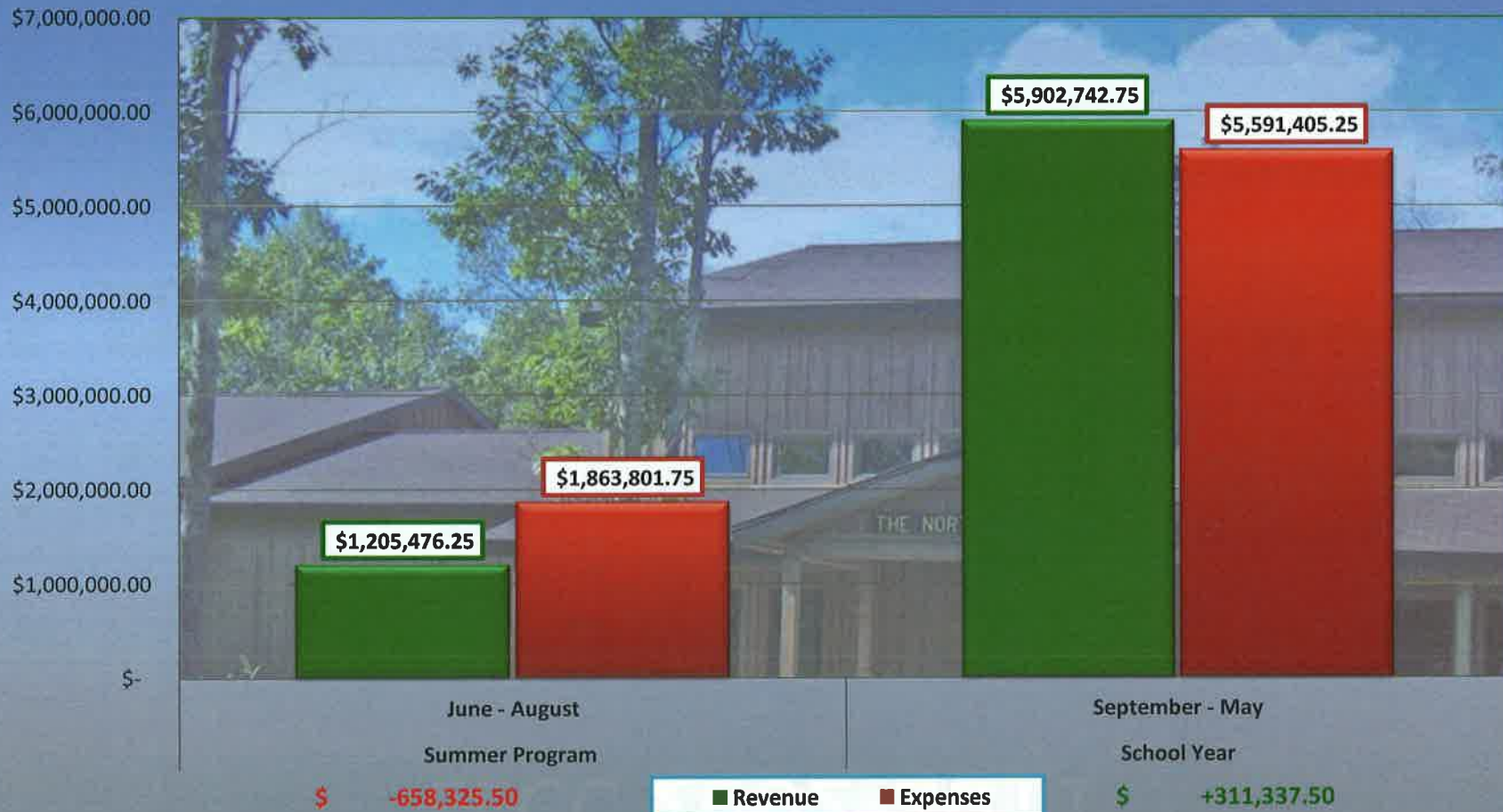

**Executive Order 12-04**

**Supporting and Strengthening Implementation of the State's Wetlands Policy**

**I, Mark Dayton, Governor of the State of Minnesota**, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes, do hereby issue this Executive Order:

**Whereas**, Minnesota Statutes, section 103A.201, subdivision 2(b) states that wetlands of Minnesota provide public value by conserving surface waters, maintaining and improving water quality, preserving wildlife habitat, providing recreational opportunities, reducing runoff, providing for floodwater retention, reducing stream sedimentation, contributing to improved subsurface moisture, helping moderate climatic change, enhancing the natural beauty of the landscape, and are important to comprehensive water management; and

**Whereas**, the same law states that it is in the public interest to achieve no net loss in the quantity, quality, and biological diversity of Minnesota's existing wetlands; increase the quantity, quality, and biological diversity of Minnesota's wetlands by restoring or enhancing diminished or drained wetlands; avoid direct or indirect impacts from activities which destroy or diminish the quantity and biological diversity of wetlands; and replace wetland values where avoidance of activity is not feasible and prudent; and

**Whereas**, wetland conservation and protection responsibilities are shared between federal, state and local agencies and private sector organizations; and,

**Whereas**, wetlands types in Minnesota vary considerably and are distributed quite differently across the State; and,

**Whereas**, wetland protection and enhancement is an integral part of accomplishing the State's clean water and outdoor heritage goals envisioned by the 2008 Legacy Amendment as prescribed in Article XI, Section 15 of Minnesota's Constitution.

**Now, Therefore**, I hereby order the Board of Water and Soil Resources, in cooperation with the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Transportation, the Minnesota Pollution Control Agency, the Minnesota Department of Agriculture, and with the invited participation of stakeholders, to undertake the following steps by December 15, 2012, regarding how to maintain No Net Loss of Wetland as a State goal under the Wetland Conservation Act and to further advance the long-term protection and enhancement of Minnesota's wetland resources:

1. Assess potential changes to current policies that will improve wetland conservation in Minnesota in a manner that maintains and restores the integrity Minnesota's wetlands, while recognizing that the ecology, distribution and type of wetland resources vary statewide.
2. Evaluate and develop recommendations to improve current wetland protection, restoration, and mitigation provisions regarding:
  - a. de minimis exemption allowances and flexibility options allowable with Board-approved Comprehensive Wetland Management Plans according to Minnesota Statutes, section 103G.2243;
  - b. alignment of pre-settlement wetland zones on watershed boundaries
  - c. consistent review, approval, and implementation for projects subject to wetland replacement requirements;
  - d. the adequacy of funding mechanisms to cover costs of inspection, monitoring and oversight of wetland bank sites; and
  - e. the costs and benefits of wetland mitigation targeted to specific watershed.
3. Develop recommendations to provide for the continued restoration of drained wetlands using various funding sources to achieve the multiple benefits that wetlands provide for strategic conservation purposes.
4. Identify opportunities to improve coordination of wetland regulatory efforts between state and federal agencies by improving the processes for landowners, permit applicants, local governments and regulators so that greater efficiency and cost-effectiveness are realized.

Other state departments and agencies shall cooperate as requested with the agencies charged with the execution of this Order. The agencies charged with execution of this Order shall use existing information to the greatest extent practicable before generating any new data or analysis.

Under Minnesota Statutes, section 4.035, subdivision 2, this Executive Order is effective 15 days after publication in the State Register and filing with the Secretary of State and shall remain in effect until December 15, 2012.

**Sec. 4. [92.80] EXPEDITED EXCHANGE OF LAND WITHIN BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE AREA WILDERNESS FOR FEDERALLY OWNED LANDS.**

**Subdivision 1. Purpose and scope.** (a) The purpose of this section is to expedite the exchange of a portion of the state-owned lands located within the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness. The state owns 116,559 acres of land within the wilderness area, 86,295 acres of which are school trust land.

(b) Exchange of school trust lands within the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness for federally owned lands located outside the wilderness area will preserve the spectacular wild areas while producing economic benefits for Minnesota's public schools.

(c) For land exchanges under this section, sections 94.342 to 94.347 apply only to the extent specified in this section.

**Subd. 2. Classes of land; definitions.** The classes of state land that may be involved in an expedited exchange under this section are:

(1) school trust land as defined in section 92.025;

(2) university land granted to the state by acts of Congress;

(3) all other lands acquired by the state in any manner and under the control of the commissioner of natural resources; and

(4) all lands acquired by the state through tax forfeiture, held subject to a trust in favor of the taxing districts, and under the control of county authorities for classification, appraisal, and sale.

**Subd. 3. Priority.** An exchange of state land under this section shall give priority to exchanges that provide the most opportunity for revenue generation for the permanent school fund, and priority shall be given to lands within the Superior National Forest in the Mesabi Purchase Unit in St. Louis County and in the following townships in St. Louis County:

(1) Township 59 North, Range 14 West;

(2) Township 59 North, Range 13 West;

(3) Township 60 North, Range 13 West; and

(4) Township 60 North, Range 12 West.

**Subd. 4. Valuation of land; goals.** (a) In an exchange of school trust land, university land, or other land under the control of the commissioner of natural resources for land owned by the United States, the examination and value determination of the land shall be done in a manner as agreed to between the commissioner and the authorized representative of the United States.

(b) In an exchange of tax-forfeited land for land owned by the United States, the examination and value determination shall be done in a manner as agreed to between the county board and the authorized representative of the United States.

(c) All lands exchanged under this section shall be exchanged only for lands of at least substantially equal value. For the purposes of this subdivision, "substantially equal value" has the meaning given under section 94.343, subdivision 3, paragraph (b). No payment is due either party if the lands are of substantially equal value but are not of the same value.

(d) The goals of the exchange shall be:

(1) the state receiving at least as many acres as the number given in exchange by the state; and

(2) reuniting mineral and surface rights.

**Subd. 5. Title.** Title to the land must be examined to the extent necessary for the parties to determine that the title is good, with any encumbrances identified. The parties to the exchange may use title insurance to aid in the determination.

**Subd. 6. Approval by Land Exchange Board.** In accordance with the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 10, all expedited land exchanges under this section require the unanimous approval of the Land Exchange Board.

Subd. 7. **Conveyance.** Conveyance of school trust land, university land, or other land under the control of the commissioner of natural resources shall be made by deed executed by the commissioner in the name of the state. Conveyance of tax-forfeited land shall be by a deed executed by the commissioner of revenue in the name of the state.

(b) School trust land, university land, and other land under the control of the commissioner of natural resources and given in exchange is subject to reservations under section 94.343, subdivision 4, and the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 10. Tax-forfeited land given in exchange is subject to reservations under section 94.344, subdivision 4, and the Minnesota Constitution, article XI, section 10.

(c) All deeds shall be recorded or registered in the county in which the lands lie.

Subd. 8. **Land status.** Land received in exchange for school trust land, university land, or other land under the control of the commissioner of natural resources is subject to the same trust, if any, and otherwise has the same status as the land given in exchange. Land received in exchange for tax-forfeited land is subject to a trust in favor of the governmental subdivision in which it lies and all laws relating to tax-forfeited land.

**Sec. 5. [92.82] PRIVATE SALE OF SURPLUS STATE LAND WITHIN BOUNDARY WATERS CANOE AREA WILDERNESS; COOK, LAKE, AND ST. LOUIS COUNTIES.**

(a) Notwithstanding sections 92.06, 92.13, 92.14, 92.45, 94.09, and 94.10, the commissioner of natural resources may sell to the United States by private sale the surplus land, including the land bordering public water, that is described in paragraph (d).

(b) The conveyance must be in a form approved by the attorney general. The attorney general may make necessary changes to the legal description to correct errors and ensure accuracy.

(c) Notwithstanding sections 92.115, 92.12, and 94.10, an appraisal of the lands is not required, and the value of the lands shall be determined in the same manner as the exchange with the United States of other state-owned lands within the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness.

(d) The land that may be sold is state-owned land under the control of the commissioner of natural resources and located within the boundary of the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness in Cook, Lake, and St. Louis Counties. The state-owned lands may include the state land for which the school trust interest was extinguished through condemnation, university lands granted to the state by acts of Congress, and all other lands acquired by the state in any manner and under the control of the commissioner of natural resources.

(e) Conveyance of state lands within the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness to the United States will preserve the spectacular wild areas while producing economic benefits for the state.

(f) Payment for state lands for which the school trust interest was extinguished through condemnation shall be used to pay the award under the condemnation action.

**Sec. 6. DELETIONS FROM STATE PARKS.**

Subdivision 1. [85.012] [Subd. 28] Interstate State Park, Chisago County. The following area is deleted from Interstate State Park: that part of Lots 8, 9, and 10 of Block 35 of the Plat of the Town of Taylor's Falls, on file and of record in the Chisago County

Dear Congressman Walz:

As Chairman of the St. Louis County Board of Commissioners, I would like to highlight our concerns relating to H.R. 1505, *the National Security and Federal Lands Protection Act*. Although we agree and support the intent of the legislation to further secure our nation's borders, we are deeply concerned that it will produce severe unintended consequences along our northern border. We appreciate your consideration of our views should this legislation receive further consideration from Congress, and urge you to vote "no" if it comes up on the floor.

As you may know, H.R. 1505, *the National Security and Federal Lands Protection Act* was introduced on April 13, 2011 by Representative Rob Bishop (R-UT-01) and was referred to the House Committee on Natural Resources, the House Committee on Agriculture, and the House Committee on Homeland Security. On April 17, 2012, the bill was discharged by all Committees with jurisdiction and placed on the Union Calendar.

In summary, this legislation would prohibit the Secretary of the Interior and the Secretary of Agriculture (USDA) from taking action on public lands which impede the border security activities of the Secretary of Homeland Security (DHS), and provides DHS immediate access to any public lands when conducting activities that assist in securing the border. The bill would also waive certain laws to all sections of the international and maritime borders within 100 miles of our nation's northern and southern border.

We are concerned that this legislation would provide the DHS with broad, unchecked control over public lands near the border while providing few, if any opportunities for state and localities to weigh in on proposed actions. The legislation would do away with numerous natural resource management and conservation laws which would require decision-making and involvement by other government agencies and could greatly impact the management of Voyageurs National Park and the Superior National Forest.

Once again, we support the intent of the legislation to secure our nation's borders; however, we strongly believe that there is a better way to provide the Department of Homeland Security with the ability and mechanisms to secure our borders. With this said, we urge you to vote "no" should this legislation reach the floor and are available should you or your staff have any questions, comments, or concerns.

# Minnesota Session Laws

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## 2012, Regular Session

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This document represents the act as presented to the governor. The version passed by the legislature is the final engrossment. It does not represent the official 2012 session law, which will be available here summer 2012.

### CHAPTER 272--H.F.No. 2164 (Excerpt)

Sec. 23. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 93.2236, is amended to read:

#### **93.2236 MINERALS MANAGEMENT ACCOUNT.**

- (a) The minerals management account is created as an account in the natural resources fund. Interest earned on money in the account accrues to the account. Money in the account may be spent or distributed only as provided in paragraphs (b) and (c).
- (b) If the balance in the minerals management account exceeds \$3,000,000 on June 30, the amount exceeding \$3,000,000 must be distributed to the permanent school fund ~~and~~, the permanent university fund, and taxing districts as provided in section 93.22, subdivision 1, paragraph (c). The amount distributed to each fund must be in the same proportion as the total mineral lease revenue received in the previous biennium from school trust lands ~~and~~, university lands, and lands held by the state in trust for taxing districts.
- (c) Subject to appropriation by the legislature, money in the minerals management account may be spent by the commissioner of natural resources for mineral resource management and projects to enhance future mineral income and promote new mineral resource opportunities.

This is certainly the case when it comes to H.R. 1505.

As good, bad or indifferent as any one of us may be from time to time about one or two of the myriad of federal agencies listed in this provision of proposed law, overall, I don't believe any of us could support the kind of carte blanche waiver of their authority that is enabled in this legislation. In a nutshell, these are the federal agencies that oversee practically every major law that Congress's has ever passed that helps to protect the air we breathe, the water we drink and the land from which we depend on for our basic sustenance.

### **RESOLUTION IN OPPOSITION TO H.R. 1505 THE NATIONAL SECURITY AND FEDERAL LANDS PROTECTION ACT**

WHEREAS, H.R. 1505, the National Security and Federal Lands Protection Act, appears to have the positive intent of helping secure our nation's borders, however, upon closer examination it has become abundantly clear to us that the bill has numerous unintended consequences and fatal flaws; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 1505 particularly grants the federal Department of Homeland Security (DHS) extraordinary authority especially over states with abundant public land ownership, regardless of whether such lands are owned by the federal, state or local government; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 1505 grants unprecedented authority in one federal agency (DHS) at a level that is clearly unnecessary which will result in an unimpeded usurpation of states' rights; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 1505 provides state and local governments few, if any, opportunities to comment or weigh in on proposed actions; and

WHEREAS, H.R. 1505 would also waive certain laws to all sections of the international and maritime borders within 100 miles of our nation's northern and southern border - a provision that certainly calls into question the public's persistent concerns about the erroneous ways of utilizing a "one size fits all" misguided approach to governance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Arrowhead Counties Association hereby encourages the entire Minnesota Congressional Delegation to vote "no" should this legislation reach the floor of either respective body. Furthermore, we encourage the author(s) of this legislation to either withdraw this bill from Congressional consideration or at the very least to substantially rework its language so that our Northern border states are exempt from the vast majority of its overly onerous, impractical and Constitutionally violating provisions.

Hello Patrick,

I know I should send a proper paper response to your letter from the Board but as a matter of expediency, please accept an email form. Despite the fact we have finished session, there is more work than hours to complete it.

In regard to the C/I and Seasonal Recreational tax elimination period, I checked with the committee administrator for taxes and the proposal was vetoed. Therefore, the 1-year freeze of the escalator was an alternative. Going back in time a bit, the initial plan had been to eliminate the tax over 20 years. I and probably others had spoken with Chair Davids, encouraging the time line to be reduced, which resulted in the 12-year plan. However, since it represents \$800 million/year (\$1.6 billion/biennium) there must be time built in to adapt to that loss of revenue. In the end, all the conversation becomes irrelevant since the governor vetoed the tax bill containing these provisions.

In regard to the MAGIC Act, there was an internal problem with movement of the bill through committee. A great deal of work had gone into the bill over at least 2 years, so it was unfortunate it hit a barrier. As I wrote in an earlier email, Chair Holberg and others were very concerned about the potential for abuses by counties such as Hennepin. I would hope that work would continue next session with elimination of possible loopholes and retention of the portions that would greatly benefit rural Minnesota counties. I had not been involved with any of the conversations until a final House caucus meeting but at that time I spoke on behalf of my counties and what the bill would mean to us. Beltrami County has been such a fine example of what can be done when local governments are given more discretion in self-direction .

I hope this has been helpful to a degree in answering your concerns. Although my time as your representative will be winding down, I'm still very much available to work on issues of concern to you.

Frank Jewell presented the financial report as prepared by ARDC.

#### **4. Legislative Report**

The legislative dinner at Mancini's on March 20 was a great success. House Representatives were called into session and could not attend but our State Senators were available and it was a good evening.

#### **Current Happenings at the Legislature.**

The legislature this year has been dubbed "dysfunctional" by local news sources. Normally by this time in the legislative process 150+ bills would be passed, this year we are looking at 20-30 bills passed. This lack of progress has earned them the nickname the "Do Nothing Legislature".

#### **Capital Investment Committee (Handout)**

Compares Governor (750 million) /Senate (500million) /House (280 million) bonding bills. House put in a lot of \$\$ for much needed improvements to the capital building. Senate and House both have their bills sitting on the floor for votes. Both are waiting for the other to go first.

It appears that NERCC will get the \$737K as requested for facility improvements (not guaranteed).

Governor will need to agree to commercial and industrial property tax relief in order to get all he wants. Relief in the form of R & D credits most likely.

#### **Bonding Bill Comparison (handout) accompanied this discussion.**

Discussion of transportation related items and the amount of money the house/senate/governor are willing to set aside.

#### **Minerals Management (HF2164 Handout)**

Page 4, Section 35. Here you will see the language for the minerals management account primary benefitting St. Louis and Itasca Counties but Lake & Cook will benefit too. Provision allows excess revenue to be distributed to various state trust funds (proportionally) and would include the tax forfeit lands trust. Note this is not included in Senate Files right now. Environment Conference Committee is backed up right now due to discussions on the proposed Fish & Wildlife fee increases.

**Land Sales** – all county's tax forfeit & riparian land sales bill likely will pass.

The only reason the land sales bill may not pass this year is because Mr. Rukavina & Dill have done a good job of convincing their colleagues that the BWCA land for School Trust Land is a better deal than what has typically happened. Up until now the state has been working on a 1/3 land 2/3 cash exchange rate.

This led to another argument on another bill – to strip DNR of trustee status for school trust lands. Some groups are claiming that the DNR has a conflict of interest on these lands and should be replaced by a more neutral third party.

Mr. Cravaack's bill for forest service land exchanges was discussed (in reference to a land exchange in the works in Cook County).

### **Discussion of Lessard Sams legacy acquisition spending**

Crow Wing County has some land on the Mississippi River (Potlatch) that is being purchased with Lessard-Sams funds – the offer was \$14 million. Crow Wing has the land assessed at \$4.5 million. The House said the Lessard offer was way too much and cut the offer to 7 Million. This is the first time Lessard-Sams spending is being questioned – could make for some interesting discussions.

### **5. AMC Report**

- Not much to report from AMC this month. There is an AMC Conference on Friday, April 20. If anyone has something they want Kevin Adee to bring up at the meeting, please let him know tonight.
- District One meeting will be held on June 15 in International Falls. There will be some type of gathering/party the evening before (June 14). Please plan to attend.

### **Questions/Comments**

Does AMC get involved with timber inventory?

Kevin does not believe so but will check on April 20.

Check with your county land departments – they are working on this.

### **6. NACO Report**

Commissioner Sve attended the legislative conference in March 2012. He spent most of his time with the Environment and Land Use Committees. Those two committees offered six resolutions this year:

#### **Environment Steering Committee**

1. Good Samaritan Resolution
  - a. (clean up of old mines)
2. Energy Storage Technology
  - a. (wind)
  - b. (solar)
3. Keystone XL Pipeline (Alberta to the Gulf of Mexico)
  - a. 13000 construction jobs
  - b. 7000 manufacturing jobs
4. Restore Act
  - a. BP Oil spill
  - b. \$\$ to be split between gulf coast states
5. Readiness in Easement
  - a. Training buffer areas around military bases.

#### **Public Lands Steering Committee**

6. Restrictions against use of lands around wilderness areas “buffer zones”

Ray LaHood – guest speaker. Very motivational speaker!

## **7. Other**

IRRRB has reinstated its demolition program. Program is available to cities, towns, townships but not counties. These monies are for demolition of residential property. It is possible that counties could apply for these monies for unorganized townships – check with IRRRB.

#### **Pine County**

- 7 out of 10 contracts signed.

#### **Lake County**

- Elections will be interesting this fall.
- They are at odds with DNR
