Flood Update

Cleanup efforts are under way around Big Sandy and other homes in Aitkin County. The curbside pickup of flood-related debris is scheduled to end this Friday, August 10th. A public seminar on **mold** with an expert from the Minnesota Department of Heath will be held on Saturday, August 18th at 10:00 a.m. at the Grace Lutheran Church.

The no-wake zones established due to the flooding conditions have all expired.

Aitkin County residents can arrange for free curbside pickup for flood-related non-commercial debris. To arrange for a pick-up, please call Tim Homstad, the Flood Debris Removal Coordinator. He can be reached at: 218-380-0355 or 218-927-7266 from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. to answer questions about debris removal or schedule a pickup. This service is scheduled to end on Friday, August 10, 2012. For more information of flood-related debris please go to the Aitkin County website at www.co.aitkin.mn.us

If you need help with your cleanup efforts or if you are willing to volunteer to help with cleanup efforts, please contact the Aitkin County CARE office at 218-927-1383.

Emergency supplies (food, water and cleaning supplies) are available at the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office and Grace Lutheran Church (Big Sandy). The denial by FEMA for a disaster declaration for individual assistance (IA) is under appeal by Governor Dayton. We are still awaiting the results of that appeal. If that request for IA is granted then Small Business Administration (SBA) programs will be provided. If the appeal is denied then the state will request that SBA provide loan assistance to eligible counties.

Dear Mr. Peysar & County Commissioners:

It is my understanding that you have received an application accompanied by a petition from the Lake Minnewawa Association (LMA) for the creation of a Lake Minnewawa Improvement District (L.I.D.). Since the LMA 's petition signing initiative from this past Memorial Day weekend, we, the Shoreline Lake Minnewawa (S.La.M.) Owners against the LID, have generated an opposing petition. Our opposition is based on numerous issues, mostly related to its organization (conflict of interest by proposed LID Board members), poor planning and the lack of vision for the future of our lake. Our attached petition relates to MN Statute 103B.521 "Initiation by Petition and establishment by county board" and MN Statute 103B.545 "Referendum on establishment". We are requesting that the County Board not support the establishment of a LID at this time and, if otherwise, that a voter referendum per 103B.545 be held before establishing a LID. The attached petition exceeds the required 26% (141 count) of S.La.M. owners' signatures necessary for a voter referendum per statute.

I would also bring to your attention that many of the LMA original petition signers have since switched their support to our position against the LID. The LMA's petition posted on the county's website also lists another 40 signatures against the establishment of the LID that I hope will be considered in your deliberations.

I have also submitted a copy of the petition and this letter to the County Administrator. I am very much available and would like to speak to the Commissioners and answer your questions as to the specifics of our opposition at the Aug. 8, 2012 Board Meeting. I will be in attendance.

We had an opportunity to buy the Armory next to the Depot. However, it just was not meant to be, with a \$355,000.00 price tag and an additional \$25,000.00 a year for upkeep. The additional space could have been used to display more of our Aitkin history, develop a research center and have our office in one location. The costs just did not make since for us. My hope is that someone will buy it or there is a possibility that it will be torn down this fall. I would hate to see one of the areas historic buildings torn down.

Three new permanent displays at the Depot are in place. The first, that I am very proud of, is the International flag display. Volunteers sanded, repainted and installed twelve flag poles along the north fence and twelve international flags from countries that settled in Aitkin County are featured with their flags history attached to the fence. Our flag display has attracted a lot of attention from people visiting Aitkin. The second is of a lumber wagon that volunteers built using four steel wheels that were donated to the museum. The third is located in the railroad room on the east wall about the railroad agent. A six car train made out of wood sitting in a train station.

Three new display cases will be added to the museum this fall. This addition will help us to display more artifacts that currently reside in our storage building. The final placement is still being worked out. Several of our current cases and some displays will have to be shifted. This will take careful planning because; we still want the entire museum to remain handicap accessible.

Sentence to Serve has come to the rescue again. They took on the project of repairing our log cabin at the fair grounds. They repaired the damaged log and chinked the cabin. The original bids on this project ranged from 6500 to 7500 dollars. STS completed the project for less than \$1000.00. Their help with our garage sale from setting up to taking down afterward can not be measured. Needless to say, without the help of STS we would not be able to afford or handle all of the projects that we under take. They also mow the grass at building #3 and shovel snow at the Depot during the winter months. Thank You STS!!!!!!!!!!!

Greg and Laura Thornbloom are working hard photographing barns and collecting barn histories for our book "Barns of Aitkin County". They have taken over 700 photographs of Aitkin County Barns since 2008. Work is progressing on Churches of Aitkin County and Schools of Aitkin County. We are still looking for more information (photos and histories) about Steamboats for a book. I am asking for help with the History Guide and map of Aitkin County. After the sites are determined, they will all have to be GPS located. This will be a brochure that will be available to all corners of Aitkin County. Do you know of a site that should be included in this map? Of course some of the sites will be located on private property, so there will be a notice on the map to respect that fact and some sites will not be available for viewing. I would like to have the four books and the brochure in print by sometime next year. Would you like to do some research for one of these projects or help to put one or more of them together? Contact me at the Depot. (218) 927-3348

Next year we expect that our revenue will be down, so several areas in our budget had to be reduced. We will be fine unless we have some unexpected expenses like in 2011 when two of our furnaces broke down. As our members become more mature we need to find a fund raiser that we can make some good money, yet is not as strenuous as lets say the garage sale. If you have any ideas about a future fund raiser contact me. Currently our fund raisers are in July, August, September and December. We need to find something we can work on in March, April or May. Put those thinking caps on and see if we can come up with something.

You can see that we have a lot going on at the Depot this year with much more next year. Check out the list of projects that have been completed so far this year and the list of projects that we are working on. More importantly, check out the items that have been donated to the museum. We are receiving a wide variety of items to add to our museums permanent collection. But, more importantly we are receiving information which is filling some of the holes in our Aitkin County history.

We are still waiting to see if we will be getting our land that is under our buildings from the railroad. There is a good chance that we will own the land by the end of the year. Cross your fingers!

Historical Society Notes Depot Museum Progress

Aitkin Independent Age - October 19, 1977

Membership in the Aitkin Historical Society now numbers 80, with 60 regular members and 20 life members, according to the groups annual report.

There were over 621 registered visitors at the depot museum this past summer. The visitors represented 16 states as well as Iceland, Germany, Sweden and British Columbia.

The museum was open in the afternoon each Wednesday and Saturday, staffed by volunteers because of the lack of finances to pay a curator.

Many more artifacts have been donated to the society during the past year. These include numerous articles from the 1901 Aitkin school, old calendars, old dress form, old duplication machine, photographs of the early logging days in Aitkin County, miscellaneous pictures and postcards, newspapers with historical headlines, WWI and WWII souvenirs, artistic scrapbooks, toys from the early days, several old display cases, baby clothing of the early 1900's, an old saddle, old farming and wooden hand tools, miscellaneous books and song books, a miniature covered wagon, adults antique clothing, several china and kitchen articles.

Three members of the board attended an all-day workshop in Grand Rapids sponsored by the Itasca County Historical Society and the Minnesota State Historical Society. Much was learned on cataloging, historical libraries and surveying historical sights.

David Nuystuen, field director of the State Historical Society, visited with the local board several times this past year, commenting favorably on the continuing progress of the depot Museum and Log Museum.

The county society is an annual paying member of the State Historical Society.

Historical Society Elects

Elections of officers for the October 1977 to October 1978 year was held at the annual meeting of the Aitkin County Historical Society Tuesday evening, October 11, at the Depot Museum.

The following officers were unanimously re-elected: John Aklestad, president; Martha Schmitt, vice president; Felix Kaplan, treasurer; Dorothy Hakes, secretary; Leona Ingersol, director, Molly Call was named lunch chairman, and Romelle Peterson was named program chairman.

Annual reports were given by the treasure and secretary. Allyn Hanson, dressed as Uncle Sam, provided a patriotic program with a talk on "I Am America."

Lunch was served to the large attendance by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Kliewere.

THE EARLY YEARS

The high incidence of saloons in early Aitkin can be directly attributed to the intense thirst generated among the loggers in their relentless search for the white pine log.

The thirsty logger could, at one period in Aitkin's early history, take his choice of over 17 saloons. The White Fawn, Costello's Place, the Green Tree, were a few of the many. They were often called sample rooms, and assisted, together with a few of the logging camp contractors, in separating the logger from his winter's pay. He was a willing victim, and the ensuing differences of opinions between imbibers often required the services of the town constable or on some occasions, the sheriff.

WILLAIM AITKIN

William Alexander Aitkin was born about 1785 in Scotland and came into the Upper Mississippi region in the early 1800's from Canada.

"W.A. Aitkin died September 16, 1851, and is buried on the east bank of the Mississippi opposite to the mouth of the Swan River in Morrison County where he had a trading post during the last nine years after 1842.


