Minnesota Legislature preview: 10 issues to watch

ST. PAUL, Minn. — The Minnesota Legislature reconvenes for a new session at noon on Tuesday, Jan. 8., with DFL m Senate. Here are 10 issues that lawmakers will likely address in the coming months.

BUDGET

The budget will be the main focus this session. Minnesota's latest economic forecast projected a \$1.1 billion deficit for Dayton will use that analysis of projected tax revenues and spending obligations to shape a budget proposal that he m "budget roller coaster" that the state has been on for the past 12 years, but he hasn't said yet exactly how he intends to controlled Legislature will spend the next several months debating it and adding ideas of its own. TAXES

Gov. Dayton has said he wants to make the state tax system fairer and simpler, and he is expected to unveil a tax refor income tax increase on the wealthiest 2 percent of Minnesotans. He also appears to have some interest in expanding t could mean new taxes on business to business services, and other services. Some have suggested taxing clothing sales. property taxes. Some business groups continue to push for collecting sales taxes on some online transactions.

HEALTH CARE

Minnesota is moving ahead with plans for a new health insurance exchange, which is required by President Obama's l consumers to comparison shop for health insurance in online marketplaces. Federal officials notified the state last mo exchange in 2014. Democrats, including Dayton, will have to find revenue to pay for the exchange while balancing the and consumer advocates worried about access. Expect Republicans to oppose whatever plan moves forward since they Care Act on both the state and federal level.

BONDING

Bonding bills are usually passed in non-budget years, but lawmakers are already talking about one for 2013. Several lc could be in such a bill after losing out last year. Lawmakers also need to address funding for another phase of State Ca projects like the Southwest Corridor should be funded. Democrats need some Republican votes to reach the 60 percer

SAME-SEX MARRIAGE

Minnesota voters rejected a Republican-backed constitutional amendment to ban same-sex marriage, and now many are promising a push for passage of a marriage equality bill this session. Same sex marriage is illegal in Minnesota. So that the divisiveness of trying to change that could end up hurting them just like the push for the amendment hurt GO

for All Families, which successfully campaigned to defeat the amendment, says it will push to legalize same-sex marriage. The DFL says it will lobby to defeat it. DFL legislative leaders may wait to see how the U.S. Supreme Court handles the issue before taking action.

EDUCATION

Gov. Dayton has said education funding is among his top priorities. But the state still owes schools more than \$1 billion in back budget deals. DFL legislators have said they want to make education funding less dependent on the passage of local property tax increases. University of Minnesota officials have promised a tuition freeze in exchange for increased state aid.

PUBLIC SAFETY

After a recent rash of high-profile shootings, there could be a renewed debate over state gun laws. Some legislators have called for tighter gun control. Others strongly disagree. Gov. Dayton has said he's willing to consider gun-control measures, but cautioned that any changes would be difficult. Expect cities and counties to also argue for increased state aid to help them pay for police and fire protection.

ELECTIONS

Minnesotans also rejected a Republican-backed constitutional amendment to require all voters to show photo identification at the polls. Legislators are expected to push for other changes in state election law. Proposals for expanded early voting options, voter eligibility requirements and voter ID are expected to come forward.

TRANSPORTATION

A recent report from Gov. Dayton's transportation advisory panel called for a higher state gas tax and other fees and tolls to fund roads and transit over the coming two decades. It's unclear how much of the report the governor might embrace in his budget.

SAND MINING

Gov. Dayton says the issue of sand mining for use in a natural gas and oil extraction process called hydraulic fracturing, which relies on injecting water, silica sand and chemicals to retrieve oil and natural gas deposits, has been controversial. Gov. Dayton and the Legislature will be forced to balance the interests of the energy industry and the jobs it provides with concerns about the long term impacts of hydraulic fracturing.

Meeting Minutes (w/Amendment)

DEC 26 2012

WELCOME –

9:04 am – The meeting began with Rick Glorvigen (Mitigation Task Force) welcoming everyone to the meeting and offering a brief summary of the Agenda and purpose of the meeting.

Flooding problem through the eyes of Aitkin County –

9:09 am - Brian Napstad (Aitkin County & MHB Commissioner/UMFM Task Force) was given the floor and asked that each attendee provide their name/title and organization they represent. Once completed, Brian took the podium to provide a synopsis of the history of flooding in and around the Aitkin area, its immediate and residual impact and to further describe this meetings intent. He explaining the development idea behind the UMFM Task Force as a cohesive group to serve as liaison in working with the ACOE on possible flood solutions.

9:13 am – Scott Turner (Aitkin County Sheriff/Emergency Mgmt. Director) was introduced at this time and provided a detailed slide presentation that identified area damage as a direct result of the June 20th - 28th, 2012 storm event that impacted locations near Big Sandy/Palisade/Aitkin and downstream to McGregor. Sheriff Turner noted safety concerns due to the impassable flood damaged roads and the inability of emergency response teams to get through to citizens if necessary. Some of the following were also addressed during discussion:

- 1) Spring flooding is an annual concern. Aitkin is very prone to flooding via the Mississippi River and other tributaries.
- 2) Flood stage begins at 12' in Aitkin. The record level of 22.49' was in 1950, which was prior to the creation of a diversion channel.
- 3) Three areas of concerns as a result of the June '12 event: Flash flooding, increase in water levels and managing emergency travel.
- 4) 50,000 sand bags were on hand in preparation, an additional 80,000 were added and at last count 110,000 +/- sand bags were utilized in and around the Aitkin area.
- 5) Big Sandy Lake experienced 'the lost summer' for that year. Area commerce was directly impacted by lost revenue due to lower levels of tourism.
- 6) Others areas to consider when calculating monetary economic impact due to flooding are the values associated with personal and commercial property damage to the area.

John Welle (Aitkin County Highway Engineer) was given the floor to provide further examples of the Public Transportation System at the time of the flood and days after. Some of the items noted were:

- 1) Undersized culverts could not handle the amount of water, resulting in 34 being completely washed out.
- 2) Gravel and road sediment was lost from area roads.
- 3) Some temporary patches failed weeks later, which created public hazards.
- 4) Total road damage cost close to a million dollars.

Flooding problems through the eyes of Pokegama Reservoir

9:35 am – Randy McCarty (Greater Pokegama Lake Assoc. – GPLA President) came forward on the next segment to cover background, environmental impact and economic concerns associated w/flooding on Pokegama Lake. Some of the following was shared with the group:

- 1) Pokegama Lake is over 6600 acres and has 55 miles of shoreline, most of which is developed.

- 2) In the last 50 yr., the lake experienced levels in the range of 1276-77 feet, eight times. Average high level is approx. 1273'. In mid May to July '12 levels exceed the 1276' mark. That amount of additional water coupled w/80 mph winds and 3 to 4 foot waves was catastrophic.
- 3) Shoreland values had decreased by approx. \$500/shoreline ft., equating to approx. \$145 million in land depreciation.
- 4) It was suggested that future dam and reservoir operating limits factor in wind and wave condition as well as the increased water levels.

ACOE – Reservoir Operation plan, History and Perspective

9:45 am – Steve Clark (ACOE) took the floor. As the past Project Manager for the ROPE (Reservoir Operating Plan Evaluation) Study he was able to offer the historic and current Reservoir Operating plans and what, if any, opportunities there are for mitigation projects to help with future extreme flood events. Steve provided details on the following topics:

- ◆ How the ACOE operates the reservoirs and how the ROPE Study was used to look for necessary modifications.
- ◆ How the ACOE handled the water event of 2012 and reservoir operation during that time.
- ◆ An over-view of the Aitkin 205 Flood Risk Reduction Study.

A slide show (w/graphs) was also provided to aid in the conversation that ensued. Some of the following topics and questions were addressed during discussion:

- 1) The ROPE Study was a 7 yr/\$4 million reservoir/dam study of the rules for operation.
- 2) 7 reservoirs are under ACOE jurisdiction: Leech, Winni, Pokegama, Cross, Whitefish, Gull and Sandy.
- 3) The reservoirs are operated/controlled for a number of reasons. Controls were initially for navigation but most recently are primarily for flood risk reduction and water quality, recreation and tribal trust.
- 4) The ROPE Study helped to determine seasonal water level targets (including winter draw-downs), flow requirements and to provide data for mitigation strategies.
- 5) The ACOE uses a chart (Guide Curve) to average the damages across all the reservoirs during flood events. The ACOE is confident when using the Guide Curve chart, as it has shown through the ROPE Study to have only a slight margin of error and indicated only a few necessary adjustments were needed. However, the 2012 storm was a unique event and brought conditions that can not be realized in the Guide Curve.
- 6) The ACOE spent upwards of \$350k on a structures and values comprehensive study of all the reservoirs. Since the damage curve was original developed back in the 1950's, it became evident that adjustments were nec. to accommodate for increased development around the reservoirs. The study showed however that the increased development areas were above flood damage levels.
- 7) **Q** – What's included in the definition of 'damages'? **A** – Habitable structures (excluding docks, sheds, landscaping etc.).
- 8) **Q** – Does the ROPE Study include structure and elevation inventory on all reservoirs? **A** – Yes.
- 9) Big Sandy was removed from the Guide Curve because it gets out of control early in an event. There are only 3 days before the water from Pokegama Lake gets to Sandy. Plans to make improvements at Sandy were considered but it is a question of funding. Federal dams throughout the nation are classified on a scale of 1 to 5, 1 being high failure probability. Sandy is a 4, so attention for this dam is not high.
- 10) **Q** - Do you have statics on how much water is coming to/from the Rice Lake reserve (Rice River)? It may make a good holding area for excess water. There are other tributaries, diversion and reserve areas to consider as well for future flood events.

- 11) **Q** - There's some amount of uncontrolled water that ends up in Aitkin that runs outside the ACOE controls – do you know what the % of that would be? **A** – Approx. 8000 cfs.
- 12) **Q** – Is the Prairie River Dam included in the 'uncontrolled waters'? **A** - Yes, but it is under Power Company control/jurisdiction.
- 13) **Q** – Are Guide Curves used for Leech and Winni reservoirs too? **A** – Yes. **Q** - Are they affected by the Guide Curves used during spring storm events? **A** – Yes, flows are adjusted but it is not 1 to 1.
- 14) **Q** – What can be done (built) to improve system operation? **A** – There must first be a Reconnaissance (Recon) Study. Much like the 1999 to 2011 local flood control study (205 watershed study) in Aitkin.

Steve Clark provided further details of the Aitkin 205 study. It started with a Recon phase (Initial Appraisal Report) that was Federally funded. There are 3 necessary elements that need to be addressed in this type of study:

- a) Activity must contribute to solving the issue.
- b) It must be economically justified, formulating a Benefits/Cost (B/C) ratio of at least 1.
- c) It must have a local sponsor (cost-share).

Steve went on to show a map of how the river snakes through the study area and the existing diversion channel built in the 1950's. Considerations that came out of the 205 study included improvement to the exist diversion channel, building an additional \$25-30 million channel to by-pass the Pine Knoll obstruction area and development of in-town levies etc. to name a few. Several issues/questions arose from this conversation:

- 1) **Q** – In the parameter of the 205 study, what does 'local' mean? **A** – Any local community or municipality. If it becomes multi-county, it would then become more of a 'watershed' study.
- 2) **Q** – When using the B/C ratio, what is the time frame for determining Benefit? **A** – Average annual benefits over 50 yrs.
- 3) **Q** – Based on the definition of 'Damage', how is it used to influence the 'Benefit' calculation/number? **A** – All the damage dollars include lost structures, agriculture and physical shoreline damages and transportation cost etc., regardless of fee title. Everything that would have a Federal impact. The big items not included in this figure are local/regional economic loses.
- 4) **Q** – Does a diversion channel solve the problem? **A** – Not as a 'stand-alone' solution, but it has helped.
- 5) **Q** – What happened to the study? **A** - The 205 was terminated in 2011 and results of the study (B/C ratio) were only Aitkin specific. If other areas and the benefits associated with less damage were included, it may have shown a positive B/C ratio. Perhaps a 'full scope impact' portion to the study should be added going forward.
- 6) **Q** - What is the process if there were no 'Federal' money to start a project? **A** – Simply draft a request to the ACOE to start a new Recon Study and any/all the necessary permits must be acquired before and during the work phases. The ACOE would not stop an entity/group from doing a study or implementing a project but if Federal money is asked for, the request has to go through an authorization/appropriations process.

Break – 10:30 am / Reconvene at 10:45 am

10:45 – Brian Napstad re-opened the meeting and asked for further questions and discussion for the remainder of today's meeting. The following represents some the topics of discussion:

- 1) **Q** - If the 1950 diversion channel had been completed, how would that have impacted the end results of the storm damage of 2012? **A** - There would've been benefits but due to the 205 study and the current condition of the diversion channel, the B/C ratio was not met in order to finish it or correct problems.

Col. Price (ACOE) added that if the study were carried further around the time of the 2012 storms, the ratio might have improved if up/down stream damages were included but the study terminated in 2011. At that time, because there was no other cost-share interest offered and the minimal criteria was not satisfied, the Study ceased.

Today, someone (entity/group) could draft a request for an expanded area Reconnaissance Study but the ACOE is 1 ½ yrs out on projects. Congress has to approve it and allot money for it in the budget and that takes time. Nothing is stopping a local group/municipality from conducting a Recon Study or project of their own however, as long as it complies with NEPA, CWA and other rules etc.

Col. Price went on to further explain the effects and viable solutions for extreme winds via 'wind banks' as used at Devils Lake in North Dakota.

- 2) **Q** – Does the region-wide approach to the Aitkin problem (that impacts other communities) increase the Feasibility threshold to a point that it can't be met? If the MHB were to pull a group together (Cities/municipalities/counties etc) to ask the government to fix a problem, does it allow that group to pick and choose projects that affect the entire system yet not put it out of reach of Federal assistance?
A – Because the span of the study increases, the cost of the study may increase some. The real challenge would be in showing the benefit increase from the current operating systems that are already in place. You cannot base calculations on frequent probability of extreme weather events like the one in June '12. The further away from Aitkin, the harder it would be to show benefit up/down stream. It would seem counter productive w/the 205 to have increased study cost in an effort to capture up stream benefit and stream damage reduction when in the immediate Aitkin area the B/C ratio was low.
- 3) **Q** – Local maps show 3' on Pokegama Lake equals 3" on Lake Winni, so operationally, can that balance be adjusted? **A** – Distance is key, Pokegama Lake can help Aitkin directly, but Winni is further away and helps little. The local Pokegama watershed also plays into this factor.
- 4) **Q** – Could raising Winni (and Leech) prior to Pokegama Lake help Aitkin? **A** – The ROPE Study addressed that and the determination was there would be minimal change.
- 5) **Q** – Would we create another problem by fixing this one? **A** – The ACOE does consider that when conducting studies.

Through further conversation, it was determined that this group needs to decide what they want to accomplish and what is needed to get there. Everyone recognizes the problem, now its time to find out what can be done by pooling efforts.

- 1) **Q** - How do we facilitate picking the partners, determining the scope based on the B/C ratio and divvying up project costs proportionately for the stakeholders? **A** – The Reconnaissance Study would help get the process started and it is 100% government funded. The only requirement is it must stay under \$100k in cost and take less than a year to complete. The cost-share factor only comes into play once the problem/issues are first defined.
- 2) **Q** - Who scopes the projects? **A** – The ACOE works w/the local sponsor. Once the Recon Study is complete, what remains of the \$100k is use to do the scope.
- 3) If the group is seeking some Federal assistance, the first step is to:
 - ◆ Draft a letter to the ACOE requesting a Reconnaissance Study and it would be placed in the budget process to get funded.
 - ◆ The Recon study would look at whether there is good likelihood of a solution, is there Federal sponsorship and would take into account the B/C ratio and Feasibility Study.
 - ◆ The next phase is to sign a Feasibility cost-share Agreement that outlines the scope and cost break-down. Once signed, contracting for the job would commence and work begins.

- 4) If no Federal cost-share is needed/wanted for the project, then the B/C ratio factor is less important. For example, if the initial Recon Study determines a B/C ratio at 1.1 then the following steps could apply:
- ◆ The group goes in with an alternative plan/project that has a ratio of 1.2 or higher.
 - ◆ The ACOE goes to Head Quarters to defend the project.
 - ◆ A Record of Decision is made and forward to the Asst. Secretary of the Army.
 - ◆ It is then checked off to go to the Office of Management and Budget and stacked with other projects w/in the US.

Unfortunately, without a ratio near 3 the project maybe at the bottom of the pile. There are a lot of factors that play into the process but the first step is to draft a letter to the ACOE requesting a Recon Study. If the Recon and Feasibility Study shows a B/C ratio above 1 but not high enough to get Congress authorization, the ACOE can still hand over all documents in support of that project so that the local authority (w/local funding, cost-share or not) can still execute the project. Both of those paths can be pursued concurrently. All that is necessary to get into queue is a request by a local entity/group to have the ACOE perform a Recon Study.

What's the next step?:

The conversation moved into summarizing what to do next. The ACOE has outlined the process but also shared the probability for success. Those in attendance should ask themselves the following:

- 1) Was enough information provided today to share it with their governing groups?
- 2) Do they feel comfortable in asking those groups whether they would be willing to help fund a project if the Recon Study determines a low ratio and it becomes nec. to seek other cost-share?
- 3) Is there shared interest to pull a group together to meet and start the process of drafting a Recon Study request letter?
- 4) Who will draft the letter, who will over-see the process and who would sit as the Task Force Directors?
- 5) How do we determine what areas to include as part of a study?
- 6) Is this area of study already growing from a standard study to a watershed approach?
- 7) Will this group want to do it alone w/out some Federal backing, or work through the Army Corp/Feds which could prove to be a lengthy process and unlikely to be approved?

Q – If the MHB were to draft the letter for the Recon Study, can we get into queue? **A** – Yes, ~~the ACOE might have the taxing authority on the books to get the study going.~~ The MHB does not have levy authority but each MHB member could go back to their respective counties for project appropriations. It is not until the start of the Feasibility Study when the entity/group has to demonstrate the capacity to obtain funds.

A final suggestion: Let us not forget to protect the infrastructure of the dams going forward as well. It is a key component to the success of any of the ideas that were discussed today.

Brian Napstad thanked everyone and the ACOE for coming to today's meeting and asked those interested to attend the MHB meeting immediately following lunch. The UMFMT Task Force is on that Agenda.

Col. Price also thanked everyone for their interest. He stated that it's clear that everyone in the Headwaters is active and understand the issues. He felt this could not be a better array of people and the ACOE is more than happy to continue the dialog and help any way possible.
