As a follow up to the extreme lake conditions of last summer and the temporary boating restrictions that the County enacted, ACLARA has surveyed its membership to give you some sense of the public's response from lake country.

The twenty lake associations in ACLARA were given six questions to send out to their members. On the following pages you will find these questions and a tally of the 105 responses received from 12 member lakes.

In addition there is a detailed worksheet enclosed with available lake level elevations for the twenty member lakes of ACLARA. Over half of the survey responses were received from just two lakes, Farm Island and Ripple. At these lakes the Highest Recorded Level in 2012 was well above Ordinary High Water. Five of the ACLARA lakes have no lake level gages.

Situations vary greatly at individual lakes. Obtaining measurements and determining threat levels was difficult last summer. We compliment you for the promptness of the actions which you took to safeguard our waters.

The recent heavy rains and high water levels have caused many serious problems for lakeshore and other riparian landowners, as well as some inconveniences for lake users. Aitkin County imposed a series of no wake restrictions during this time, in order to minimize the damages to lake shores and property, and there was considerable disagreement about these restrictions.

As a reminder, the County initially placed no wake restrictions on all lakes; then, after determining actual lake levels, the County lifted restrictions on lakes that were less than 12 inches above their Ordinary High Water Mark (OHWM), and continued no wake restrictions on lakes that were at least 12 inches higher than their OHWM. Lakes that were 12-18 inches above this level were restricted to 300 foot no wake zones, while those with levels higher than 18 inches above the OHWM were completely no wake. A few weeks later all restrictions were lifted, even though many lakes remained higher than normal.

Now that we have experienced these extreme events and the resulting damages, the Aitkin County Lakes and Rivers Association <u>wants to hear your thoughts</u> about the County's no wake restrictions in general, and your evaluation of whether the restrictions were appropriate for your lake.

An application for an Aitkin County Large Assembly Permit is being submitted for the above named ATV event. This is an ATV/UTV riding event where participants will bring their ATV/UTV to the Quadna Mountain Park & Resort to ride the park trails, look at manufacturer displays, watch organized Mud Bog and Obstacle Course competitions and be entertained in the evenings with movies and a concert. Some will camp in RVs and tents and some will stay off-site at area hotels. There will be vendors present selling various products and services.

Attendees may also ride the adjoining state trail system if they choose. Riders will be advised by signage (verbiage provided by ATVAM), distribution of the Minnesota Dept. of Natural Resources Off Highway Vehicle Regulations for 2012-2013 and a dedicated vendor booth for use by the DNR &/or Aitkin County Land Department's Land Commissioner as to the requirements and restrictions of riding the state trails. If possible, there will also be a booth for purchasing a state trail permit, for those coming from other areas who wish to ride the trail system. If it is not possible, riders will be made aware of where they can purchase a trail pass in the Hill City area. Information about the trails and permit requirements have been made available on the event website www.quadnamudnationals for a minimum of 45 days.

The following addresses the license requirements for the permit per the Aitkin County Ordinance regulating assemblage of large numbers of people at shows or exhibitions:

- 1.03 This permit is being requested by High Lifter Products, Inc. located at 780 Professional Drive North, Shreveport, Louisiana. The name of the event is the Quadna Mud Nationals, an ATV/RUV event to be held at Quadna Mountain Park, owned by Mark Warnert and Brian Bauerly and located at 400 Quadna Mountain Road, Hill City, MN.
- 1.06 See attached Schedule of Events.
- **2.01** A public hearing to review the application is scheduled for June 11, 2013.
- **2.03** A check from High Lifter Products, Inc. was forwarded to the Aitkin County Auditor on or about May 7, 2013.

An insurance certificate naming Aitkin County as additionally insured on our General Liability as required and the required surety bond with revised rider issued for \$10,000 from Western Surety Company has been forwarded to the Aitkin County Administrator's Office.

- a. The proposed event will be held at Quadna Mountain Park, 400 Quadna Road, Hill City, MN. The owners of the property are Mr. Mark Warnert and Mr. Brian Bauerly.
- **b.** The nature of this assembly is to promote ATV riding in an organized environment through competitions and related activities, and bring public awareness to the products and services offered by the vendors present.
- c. This is a 4 day event. The event will open at 8 am on Thursday, June 20, 2013 and will close at Noon, on Sunday, June 23, 2013.
- **d.** This permit is requested on an attendance of 4,000 people. Based on past first time events of this nature in other locations, the estimated expected attendance is 1,800 2,000, however, in case it exceeds this amount due to the amount of interest shown, we are preparing for 4,000.
- e. 2. Access There will be 3 gates that everyone must pass through in order to gain entry to or exit the park. These gates will be manned by security and staff members beginning 8 am Thursday, June 20 and remaining open 24 hrs a day until the event closes on Sunday, June 23 to control admission. Because of the placement of the gates, there is not an adequate way to fence it off, however through signage and the presence of personnel, no one will be permitted to enter without obtaining a pass.
 - 3. Water A water sample from the well on-site was tested by county officials and found to meet all federal, state and local requirements for sanitary quality. This well is capable of an output of 200 gallons per minute/12,000 gallons per hour, which by far exceeds the requirement for the maximum number to be assembled (4,000) at a rate of one gallon per person per day.
 - **4. Toilet Facilities** With the proposed attendance of 4,000, High Lifter Products has contracted Goble Portable Toilets in Aitkin, MN and Port-Able John Rental & Service in Bemidgi, MN to provide and service 80 portable toilet units that will be distributed throughout the vendor area, at each gate, at competition event locations and throughout the camping areas in pairs. Arrangements have also been made for additional units to be delivered during the event if the need arises.
 - **5. Solid Waste** The park provides two 30 yard waste disposal containers, and another two 30-yd solid waste disposal containers will be obtained from Waste Management in Cohasset, MN, as well as 15-20 50 gallon drums to be used as trash cans. One large container will be located in the vendor area and the others in the main camping areas. Garbage cans will be located throughout the vendor and camping areas for convenience, as well as at each gate location. A schedule for emptying the trash cans twice a day throughout the event by High Lifter staff is in place. Arrangements are also in place for the local ATV club to assist in cleanup at the close of the event on Sunday, June 23, 2013.
 - **6. Lighting** Lighting will be provided in the vendor area and any scheduled night events such as the concert, by four (4) large stationary stadium-type lights positioned high on light poles as well as 4 stadium lights stationary on the back side of the chalet that faces the hills and the bowl area. They will sufficiently illuminate the entire vendor area and surrounding parking and Chalet areas. In addition, the concert will have stage lighting that will provide additional lighting in that specific area surrounding the stage.

- 7. Event Safety & Security High Lifter takes security at their events extremely seriously. While we hope there will not be a need for them, High Lifter will have security in place on-site should the need arise. There will be a minimum of 4 security personnel at all times. These will consist of two off-duty Minnesota law enforcement officers as well as two cadets from the Hibbing Community College Law Enforcement Academy. During peak times when the potential for possible problems may increase, such as 6 pm Friday evening thru 6 am Saturday morning, we will increase this by two officers on duty, for a total of 6. If the need arises, we will have 2 additional officers on stand-by. These officers will be given a ATV/UTV for officers to patrol the park in an effort to be proactive in preventing any problems. Each will be equipped with a Motorola radio in which they can communicate with each other and the entire High Lifter staff, if necessary. In addition to the hired security staff, High Lifter will have its staff of 27 at the park. High Lifter employees are experienced in these types of events and acts as additional "eyes & ears" for any potential problems and will react and/or alert security as they see fit. High Lifter is also bringing 3 additional individuals who they work closely with at the same type of event they host in Texas that has an average of 14,000 attend each year. One is a Texas deputy sheriff as well as a licensed paramedic who will act as a backup to either security or EMS should the need arise. He has worked in the security/EMS position at these types of events for the past 9 years, and brings experience in crowd control/management. The other two gentlemen from Texas are key members of the park management. They bring experience in traffic control and logistical problem solving. A plan is in place to have a oneway traffic pattern throughout the park to prevent the traffic entering the event from backing up on public Hwy 169. Should the traffic become backed up, we will immediately form two lines of traffic beginning at the north side of Airport Road. Traffic exiting the event will be directed by signage and personnel to exit via the south end of Airport Road back onto Hwy 169. Because the main gate and exit gate will remain open throughout the event, security will never be without members of the High Lifter staff to offer assistance should it become necessary. In the event of inclement weather, a plan is in place to offer safety to those in attendance. Quadna Mountain Park is equipped with an outside sound system strong enough to be heard to the back corners of the park. An announcement would be made over the loudspeaker alerting patrons of storm warnings. They would then be directed to seek shelter in either the chalet or the resort lodge. The basement of the Chalet and the hallways & basement of the Quadna Mountain Lodge would adequately hold those seeking shelter.
- **8. Fire Protection** All camping areas are located off of one or more major roadways within the park where fire or rescue vehicles can access efficiently. The larger camping areas will be marked so that a path will be provided around the camping area to allow for emergency vehicles. The smaller areas are located directly on a path or gravel road. The local Hill City Fire Department has been notified of the dates of the event so that they will be on standby should they be needed.
- **9. Telephone Communication** Due to modern technology wherein most individuals carry a cell phone on their person as a routine practice, having landline phone service is essentially ineffective. We will, however, have signs posted throughout the park providing riders with a primary and secondary number to call in case of an emergency. Those numbers will be monitored by members of our staff around the clock. Campgrounds will also be numbered and

marked with signage that corresponds with the map provided in the program to make locating someone in need easier should they need assistance in some way.

- 10. Medical Services An RN. licensed in the State of Minnesota and 2 EMS will be on-site during the event as well as the paramedic from Texas, who can offer assistance should the need arise. An ambulance from Grand Rapids will be on-call should it become necessary to transport someone to the hospital in Grand Rapids. This was approved by county officials during a conference call on 5/15/2013.
- 11. Parking Both camping, ATV and automobile parking has been provided for during this event. Not all patrons will camp at the park, many will stay in area hotels and locals will commute back and forth to the park each day from their homes. There are designated automobile parking areas for those that are coming without an ATV and are not camping. Based on the formula provided by the ordinance of 1 space for every 4 people and using 240 sq ft per automobile, there is enough parking in Auto Parking areas 1 & 2 to accommodate 246 cars/984 people. Camping areas have been numbered on all maps, 1 - 18. The combined space available for camping is a minimum of 509,651.25 sqft. Using a formula of 600 sq ft per camper, Quadna Mountain Park would accommodate 849.4 RVs. Using the same formula in the Ordinance of 1 space per 4 people, there is camping available for 3,398 people. See attached breakdown of each area.
- 12. Noise The main area where a concentration of people may gather is centrally located on the property and nothing is scheduled in the planned event that should generate unreasonable noise as to disturb the surrounding property owners.
- 13. Food Concessions There will be food concessions available during the event. At this time, one food vendor has agreed to participate in the event. Mr. Cory Harris, owner of Harris Concessions from Coon Rapids, MN (763-498-3276) will be present selling food items. Should any additional food vendors participate, they will be directed to contact Ms. Michelle Leitinger of the Aitkin County Environmental Services Department.



394.26 PUBLIC HEARINGS.

Subdivision 1.[Repealed, <u>1974 c 571 s 51</u>]

- Subd. 1a. When required. In addition to public hearings required by section 375.51 prior to the adoption by ordinance of any comprehensive plan or amendments thereto or of any official control or amendment thereto, public hearings shall be held before any conditional use permit, interim use permit, variance, or proposal for a subdivision is approved or denied by the responsible authority, and in circumstances where a public hearing is otherwise required by sections 394.21 to 394.37. Such public hearings may be continued from time to time and additional hearings may be held.
- Subd. 2. **Notice.** Notice of the time, place, and purpose of any public hearing shall be given by publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the town, municipality, or other area concerned, and in the official newspaper of the county, at least ten days before the hearing, except that notice of public hearings in connection with the adoption by ordinance of any comprehensive plan or amendments thereto or adoption or amendment of any official controls shall be given in the manner provided by section 375.51, subdivision 2. In addition to the requirements of section 375.51, subdivision 2, written notice of public hearings on all official controls and amendments thereto shall be sent to the governing bodies of all towns and all municipalities located within the county. Written notice of public hearings regarding the application of official controls to specific properties, including but not limited to conditional uses, variances, interim uses, zoning regulations, and subdivision regulations, shall be sent to all property owners of record within 500 feet of the affected property in incorporated areas. In unincorporated areas, the written notice shall be sent to property owners as follows:
 - (a) in the case of variances, to owners of record within 500 feet of the affected property;
- (b) in the case of conditional uses and interim uses, to owners of record within one-quarter mile of the affected property or to the ten properties nearest to the affected property, whichever would provide notice to the greatest number of owners;
- (c) in the case of all other official controls, including but not limited to zoning regulations and subdivision regulations, to owners of record within one-half mile of the affected property.

Written notice shall also be given to the affected board of town supervisors, and the municipal council of any municipality within two miles of the affected property.

Subd. 3.[Repealed, 1974 c 571 s 51]

Subd. 3a. **Who runs hearing.** The board may assign responsibility to conduct public hearings for one or more purposes to the planning commission, board of adjustment or any official or employee of the county, except as provided in section <u>375.51</u>.

COUNTY OF AITKIN

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING ASSEMBLAGE OF LARGE NUMBERS OF PEOPLE AT SHOWS OR EXHIBITIONS OF ANY NATURE

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS, pursuant to the authority vested in it by Minn. Stat. 375.40 the Aitkin County Board of Commissioners desires to regulate the assemblage of shows or exhibitions of any nature whether such shows or exhibitions are conducted indoors or outdoors; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this ordinance is to protect the health, safety and welfare of all persons in Aitkin County, residents and visitors alike, who will partake in or be affected by such assemblage;

NOW THEREFORE, the Aitkin County Board of Commissioners hereby ordains:

Section 1. LICENSE REQUIREMENT

- 1.01 No person shall permit, maintain, promote, conduct, advertise, act as an entrepreneur, undertake, organize, manage, or sell or give tickets to an actual or anticipated assembly of 100 or more persons for an exhibition or show of any nature, whether on public or private property, unless a license to hold such assembly has first been secured in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.
- 1.02 A license to hold an assembly issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall permit any person to engage in any lawful activity in connection with the holding of the licensed assembly.
- 1.03 As used in this ordinance, "person" means any individual human being, partnership, corporation, firm, company, association, society or group; and "assembly" means a company or group of persons gathered together at any location at any time for any purpose.
- 1.04 A separate license shall be required for each event up to one week duration and each location at which 100 or more persons assemble or can reasonably be anticipated to assemble.
- 1.05 A license shall permit the assembly of only the maximum number of persons stated in the license. It is understood that the County Board may impose restrictions on the maximum number of persons which will be assembled in the license issued if such restrictions are deemed necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of those persons who will be in attendance and/or other residents of Aitkin County. The licensee shall not sell tickets to nor permit to assemble at the license location more than the maximum permissible number of persons stated in the license.
- 1.06 No performance or other activity in connection with the licensed show or exhibition shall occur between the hours of 1 a.m. to 6 a.m.

Section 2. LICENSE APPLICATION AND CONDITIONS FOR ISSUING LICENSE

- 2.01 License applications may be obtained from and must be submitted to the Aitkin County Auditor at least thirty (30) days before the assembly is scheduled to occur. Applications for assemblages of 100 to 499 persons shall be placed on the County Board's agenda and heard in the normal course of business. Applications for assemblages of 500 persons or more shall require that the Aitkin County Board of Commissioners shall conduct a public hearing and notices thereof shall be given in compliance with Minnesota Statutes, Section 394.26.
- 2.02 Upon receipt of license application, the Aitkin County Auditor shall forward a copy of the same to the Clerk of the Town Board of the township in which the assembly is scheduled to occur for such Town Board's review.
- 2.03 Every license application shall be accompanied by a fee pursuant to the following schedule:

100 - 499 persons \$ 100.00 500 or more persons \$ 250.00

Every application for such assembly shall be accompanied by a bond, either in cash or underwritten by a surety company licensed to do business in Minnesota, in the following amounts:

100 - 499 persons \$ 5,000.00 500 or more persons \$10,000.00

Said bond will be conditioned that there will be no damage to any County highway, street or other public property arising out of or as a result of the licensed assembly and that the licensee will promptly and fully repay or repair any damages so done, and that all provisions of this ordinance and conditions imposed by the County Board in the issuance of such license are fully complied with by the licensee.

- 2.04 The application shall contain a statement made upon oath or affirmation that the statements contained therein are true and correct to the best knowledge of the applicant and shall be signed by the individual making application and said signature shall be properly certified by a notary public. In the case of a corporation, a partnership, or an unincorporated association, society, or group, the application shall be signed and acknowledged by an authorized officer, partner or member of said corporation, partnership or association, society or group.
 - 2.05 The application shall contain and disclose:
- (a) The address and legal description of all property upon which the assembly is to be held, together with the name, residence, and mailing address of the record owners of all such property;
 - (b) The nature or purpose of the assembly:
- (c) The total number of days and/or hours during which the assembly is to last:
 - (d) The maximum number of tickets to be sold, if any;

- (e) A plan for conducting the proposed assembly which shall include, at a minimum, the following elements:
- 1. The determination by the applicant of the maximum number of people which shall be assembled or admitted to the location.
- 2. A fence or barrier completely enclosing the proposed location sufficient height and strength to prevent people in excess of the maximum permissible number from gaining access to the assembly grounds, which shall have sufficient entrances and exits to allow easy movement into and out of the assembly grounds. This requirement may be waived if the County Board finds that a fence will not be necessary for crowd control.
- 3. Portable water, meeting all federal, state and local requirements for sanitary quality, sufficient to provide drinking water for the maximum number of people to be assembled at the rate of at least one gallon per person per day.
 - 4. Separate enclosed toilets for males and females, meeting all state and local specifications, conveniently located throughout the grounds, sufficient to provide facilities for the maximum number of people to be assembled in accordance with the Minnesota State Board of Health Regulations and standards.
 - 5. A sanitary method of disposing of solid waste in compliance with state and local laws and regulations, sufficient to dispose of the solid waste production of the maximum number of people assembled at the rate of at least 2.5 lbs. of solid waste per person per day, together with a plan for collecting and holding all such waste at least once each day of the assembly's continuance, and sufficient trash containers and personnel to perform such tasks.
 - 6. If the assembly is to continue during hours of darkness, illumination sufficient to light the entire area of the assembly, but not to shine unreasonably beyond the boundaries of the enclosed location of the assembly.
- 7. Security and traffic controls which will meet the requirements of local authorities and the Minnesota Department of Public Safety. Such controls shall include, but not be limited to, regularly employed off-duty Minnesota law enforcement officers, or other security officers whose qualifications are deemed to be sufficient by the County Board, sufficient to provide adequate security for the maximum number of people to be assembled for the purpose of viewing the show or exhibition.
- 8. Fire protection sufficient to meet all applicable state and local laws and regulations which are in effect, or may be set forth by the County Board in granting a license under this ordinance. Such fire protection shall include, but not be limited to, extinguishing devices, fire lanes and escapes, and sufficient emergency personnel to efficiently operate the required equipment.
- 9. Telephones connected to outside lines for public use, at the rate of at least one separate line for each 1000 or fraction thereof people to be assembled, and at least one telephone connected to a separate outside line which shall be available for emergency use at all times.

10. Physicians and nurses licensed to practice in Minnesota, according to the following schedule:

100 to 499 persons 1 licensed practical nurse (LPN)

and, 1 properly equipped ambulance

500 to 4999 persons 1 registered nurse (RN)

and, 1 properly equipped ambulance

*5000 or more persons 1 physician

and, 1 registered nurse (RN)

and, 1 properly equipped ambulance

together with an enclosed, covered structure where adequate medical treatment may be rendered, containing separately enclosed treatment rooms for each physician.

*in increments of 5,000 persons or fractions thereof above 5,000 persons requires said personnel for each increment.

- 11. A parking area inside the assembly ground sufficient to provide parking space from the maximum number of people to be assembled, at the rate of at least one parking space for every four persons.
- 12. All reasonable necessary precautions to ensure that the sound of the assembly will not carry unreasonably beyond the enclosed boundaries of the location of the assembly.
- 13. If the assembly is anticipated to continue for four (4) or more hours, facilities or plans for the provision of food to the maximum number of people to be assembled in compliance with all federal, state and local laws, ordinances, and regulations to ensure sanitary quality.

Section 3. ADDITIONAL LICENSE CONDITIONS

- 3.01 No License granted pursuant to this ordinance shall become effective until the licensee has submitted to the Aitkin County Auditor certificate of insurance, naming Aitkin County as an additional insured under the policy acquired, indicating that the licensee has obtained comprehensive general liability insurance covering any injury or damage caused by or resulting from the conducting of the assembly licensed under this ordinance, in the minimum amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00) for injuries to, damages to and/or death of any one person and Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$600,000.00) for total injuries and/or damages arising from any one occurrence. The Board has the authority to require higher liability limits.
- 3.02 As a condition of the granting of a license under this ordinance, the licensee agrees to allow representatives of the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office and /or any other County officials access to the property at which the licensed assembly will occur to determine if the provisions of this ordinance and/or the license conditions are or may be properly complied with. This right of access shall continue for 24 hours following the end of the licensed activity.

3.03 It is understood that the County may impose any additional conditions in the license necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of those persons who will be in attendance and/or other residents of Aitkin County.

Section 4. REVOCATION

- 4.01 Any license granted under this ordinance may be revoked by the County Board at any time prior to the assembly for which a license has been granted, if:
 - (a) any of the conditions necessary for the issuing of or contained in the license are not complied with; or
 - (b) any condition previously met ceases to be complied with; or
 - (c) any other provision of this ordinance is violated.
- 4.02 If during the course of the show or exhibition for which a license has been granted hereunder it appears in the judgment of the Aitkin County Sheriff that there exists an imminent danger of outbreak of, violence, riot or other calamity threatening the physical health or safety of those in attendance at the assembly and/or the residents of the community in which the assembly is held, the Sheriff shall be empowered to take whatever action he deems appropriate to protect said persons, including temporarily suspending the license granted if he deems such action necessary. Any such suspension by the Sheriff shall be effective immediately and a hearing shall be held before the County Board at the earliest opportunity. In the event the County Board deems such suspension improper, the license shall be reinstated or the license application fee refunded, whichever action the licensee requests.

Section 5. OPERATION

- 5.01 The licensee or his agents shall maintain the assembly premises and facilities in a clean, orderly and sanitary condition at all times.
- 5.02 No animals or household pets, not normally residing or directly involved in the show or exhibition or the policing thereof, shall be permitted on any of the grounds or facilities, and no animals or pets shall be permitted to run loose.
- 5.03 No fires of any kind shall be permitted on the premises or facilities except in grills or at locations designated in the plan/license for that purpose.
- 5.04 No person shall engage in any conduct which violates a federal, state, county, or local law, ordinance, or regulation.

Section 6. EXCEPTIONS

6.01 This ordinance shall not apply to any regularly established, permanent place of worship, stadium, arena, auditorium, resort, conference center, work place, coliseum, or other similar permanently established place of assembly.

- 6.02 This ordinance shall not apply to any shows or exhibitions held within the incorporated limits of a city.
- 6.03 The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to any show or exhibition held in connection with the Aitkin County Fair.

Section 7. ENFORCEMENT

- 7.01 The provisions of this ordinance may be enforced by injunction in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- 7.02 The holding of an assembly in violation of any provision or condition contained in this legislation shall be deemed a public nuisance and may be abated as such.
- 7.03 Any person, corporation, partnership, or unincorporated association, society or group which violates any provision of this ordinance shall be guilty of misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine not to exceed Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) or by imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days, or both. Each separate day of violation shall be considered a separate offense. In the event a violation of this ordinance occurs by action of a corporation, a partnership, or an unincorporated association, society or group, the respective officers, partners, or members of said corporation, partnership, association, society or group shall be subject to prosecution under this section in accordance with the provisions of Minn. Stat. Section 609.05.
- 7.04 Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance or any condition upon which he/she is granted a license shall be personally responsible for damages to public or private property arising out of or in connection with said violation and shall be subject to any civil relief that may be reasonable and proper. In the event a corporation, a partnership, or an unincorporated association, society or group violates any provision of this ordinance or any condition upon which a license is granted, the officers, partners, or members of said corporation, partnership, association, society or group shall be subject to the penalties set forth in this section.

Section 8. VARIANCE & APPEAL

8.01 The County Board may grant a variance from the requirements of this ordinance in any particular case where the applicant can show that strict compliance with this ordinance would cause exceptional and undue hardship by reason of the special nature of the proposed assembly or by reason of the fact that the circumstances make the requirements of this ordinance unnecessary; provided that such variance may be granted without detriment to the public health, safety, or welfare and without impairing the intent and purpose of these regulations. Economic considerations alone shall not constitute a hardship if reasonable alternatives exist under the terms of this ordinance. The County Board may impose conditions in the granting of variances to insure compliance, protect adjacent properties and the public interest.

8.02 Any person, or any department or unit of local government, or of the State of Minnesota may appeal any decision of the County Board, pursuant to this ordinance, to the District Court having jurisdiction by the same persons, departments, boards or commissions or units of government.

Section 9. SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this ordinance shall be severable and should any Court of competent jurisdiction adjudge any provision of this ordinance to be invalid, such judgment shall not affect any other provisions of this ordinance not specifically included in said judgment.

Section 10. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAWS, ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS

- 10.1 The provisions of this ordinance are cumulative to all other laws, ordinances and regulations heretofore passed or which may be passed hereafter by the State of Minnesota and the County of Aitkin.
- 10.2 Nothing contained in this ordinance shall be construed to waive or otherwise satisfy the obligations or restrictions imposed by State statute or County ordinance or regulation concerning the sale of nonintoxicating malt liquor or intoxicating liquor.

Section 11. EFFECTIVE DATE

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication according to law.

DISTRICT DIRECTOR ELECTIONS

from the Association of Minnesota Counties' Bylaws

SECTION 3. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE OF DISTRICT DIRECTORS. The election and term of office of District Directors shall be as follows:

Subd. 1. Election. The delegates from the counties of each Association district shall elect one or more delegates to represent the counties of the district on the Board. A quorum shall consist of 50% of a districts' delegation. Directors shall be elected at the first meeting after April 1st of the counties of the district. Each district shall be represented by one director except that any district and all larger districts having a population which is three times as large as the next smaller district shall be entitled to be represented by five directors. Directors elected from odd numbered districts shall be elected during odd numbered years and directors elected from even numbered districts shall be elected during even numbered years provided, however, that any district entitled to be represented by five directors shall provide for staggered terms of three directors elected in even numbered years and two directors elected in odd numbered years.

Subd. 2. Term of Office. The term of office for each District Director shall be for two years and shall begin on the first day following district elections. A District Director may serve three (3) full consecutive terms after which one term must elapse before the individual can serve again as a District Director from that district.

Subd. 3. Alternate Director. Each district shall elect an alternate Director. If the District Director cannot fulfill the role as a representative for the district, due to accident, illness or prolonged absence, the alternate Director shall serve. Such alternate director shall be elected at the same time as the District Director.

SECTION 4. VACANCIES. If a vacancy occurs in the office of District Director by reason of death, removal or resignation, the alternate Director shall fill the unexpired term of office.

SECTION 5. VOTING. Each director, or alternate as designated in Section 3, subdivision 3, on the Board shall be entitled to one (1) vote. There shall be no proxy voting. All motions shall carry by a simple majority unless otherwise specified in the bylaws.

Notice of Special Election Proposed Lake Minnewawa Lake Improvement District Referendum on Establishment (Day), (Month Date, Year)

Pursuant to Minnesota Statute 103B.545 and Minnesota Rule 6115.0970, the Aitkin County Board of Commissioners has called a special election for (Day), (Month Date, Year) from (time) am/pm until (time) am/pm at (insert location) for a referendum vote on the establishment of the proposed Lake Minnewawa Lake Improvement District. The question submitted and to be voted upon by the qualified voters and property owners within the proposed lake improvement district is the following:

"Should a lake improvement district be established to provide the programs and be financed as outlined in the July 9, 2012 Petition document?

The purpose of the LMLID is to provide a reliable and equitable source of funding to Lake Minnewawa Association (LMA), in order to continue their water quality management and control of excessive weed growth as directed by the DNR Lake Management Plan. The LMLID and a successful LMA will promote public health and welfare through improved water quality. Water quality will be improved for swimming, navigation, boating, fishing and other lake recreation.

LMA was started by a group of concerned citizens in 1961. The founding name was Save Minnewawa Association (SMA). Initially they used pontoons to hand-cut and pull weeds in an effort to save the lake. At that time, most lakeshore owners pulled their docks and boats from the lake in early July due to excessive weed growth. In 1981 a weed harvester was purchased. As time went by, the need for a larger harvester became apparent. The harvester used today is a 1982 model which was purchased in 1994.

The classification of Lake Minnewawa is a low-depth eutrophic lake. As such, the weed problem will never go away. Without the LMA weed harvesting operation and work with the DNR, Lake Minnewawa would become a dried up weed bed. In 1982 the first DNR sponsored Lake Management Plan was prepared. The established relationship between LMA and DNR continues with amendments and updates to the Plan made as needed and required. Volunteer Citizen Water quality monitoring with secchi disk reading has been done since 1979. (in association with the Minnesota PCA)

The LMA has managed to meet the increasing costs of operation (fuel; equip repairs; parts; payroll; insurance; taxes), but the future looks tentative. In researching used harvesters, 2 separate used harvesters have been for sale during the last 2 years at an approximate average cost of \$100,000. The cost of even a used harvester, let alone a new machine is currently out of reach with the yearly budget of the association. As the LMA board looks into the future; with current source of funds unreliable and the need for replacement equipment, it becomes obvious that a consistent, substantial source of funding is required.

A lake improvement district will establish a reliable and equitable source of funds to ensure the continued success of the LMA. The LMLID will expand the current 126 donating property owners to 522. All 522 property owners will benefit from access to a clear and navigable lake, with increased property values.

All lakeshore properties of Lake Minnewawa – Aitkin County Minnesota (01003300) will be included in the LID. The LID will also include those back-lot properties with deeded access to lakeshore property on the lake and those properties abutting state owned lakeshore property. All of these properties have direct access to the lake with the ability to place a personal dock. As such they all benefit from the increased values which the LID will provide. Those properties which are part of a larger development such as Savanna Ridge, will receive the assessment in the year after they are sold from the developer. Details of the full watershed area of Lake Minnewawa is included as part of the DNR Lake Management Plan.

We do not expect than there will be any lands or waters which will be adversely affected by the LID.

The programs to maintain and improve the health of Lake Minnewawa will be financed with an annual special assessment of \$65 per property. This LMLID assessment amount is based on the need to provide 75% of the average current LMA expenses, provide for additional harvesting equipment and a small amount for LID reporting expenses. In order to keep the costs as low as reasonably possible, the LMA Board of Directors is committed to achieving their mission through a mix of this special assessment, with continued volunteer and community donations.

There are 2 public accesses on Lake Minnewawa and a number of sites "dedicated to the public".

Total valuation of properties included in the MNLID is \$ 102,326,500.

The purpose of Lake Minnewawa Association (LMA) is to promote lake stewardship by providing education and services about controlling pollution, beautification, water safety and clear passage. In general it is dedicated to maintaining and improving the natural resources of Lake Minnewawa by educating, creating, promoting, and implementing methods of improving and preserving the overall condition of the lake. Funding provided through the MNLID will help support continued community benefits. Community service activities include: collection for McGregor area Food Shelf; highway cleanup; Township Spring Clean-up; Kids fishing. Promotion of good lake stewardship and providing of information is done through an annual packet distribution; numerous email mailing and a regularly maintained web page.

For the purpose of this special election -

a qualified voter is a person 18 years of age or older, a United States Citizen and who has maintained their residence within the boundaries of the proposed lake improvement district for at least 20 days immediately preceding the special election.

a property owner is a Minnesota or Non Minnesota resident with legally recorded ownership interest in the real property located within the boundaries of the proposed lake improvement district.

Qualified voters and property owners who will be absent on Election Day can submit an absentee ballot at the Aitkin County Auditor's office located at 209 Second Street, Aitkin, MN 56431 during normal business hours beginning (Day), (Month Date, Year). The County Auditor's office can be contacted by calling 218-927-7354 by email at kpeysar@co.aitkin.mn.us.

To facilitate the administration of this special election, qualified voters and property owners are encouraged to bring documentation that they either reside in and/or own property within the boundaries of the proposed lake improvement district, for example, a current property tax statement, Minnesota Driver's License, Minnesota Identification Card etc.

Note – This Notice of Special Election is being mailed to the primary and alternate taxpayers currently identified in the County's property tax system as owning property within the boundaries of the proposed lake improvement district. It is the responsibility of the primary and alternate taxpayers to notify any other individuals with a legally recorded ownership interest in their property.

On May 4, 2013 I responded to a dog complaint at the Richard Jackman residence. Mr. Jackman called and said his neighbor's dog came after him again. Dispatcher Mower advised that Deputy Winter had taken a complaint on March 28, 2013 of the similar thing; see ICR # 13-1080. On March 29, 2013, Casey Zalomsky was served Potential Dangerous Dog papers for Apollo.

I met with Mr. Jackman at his residence and he gave me a statement about the incident. He said he walked down to get his mail today at 1145. He was walking on 432nd Place past the neighbor's residence where the dog lives. He said the white dog was inside the house barking at him. When he was on his way back home, he noticed the white dog was outside. He said the white dog came on the road at him. It was aggressively barking at him and he was in fear of being bit.

When the dog got close to him he hit it in the head with his cane. I asked him what the dog did when he hit it. He told me the dog left him alone. Mr. Jackman said the kids were yelling for the dog to come back. A woman then came out of the house and was able to get the dog under control and back into the house. Mr. Jackman said this is the second time the dog has charged him. He described the dog as a large white English Bulldog. See his statement for further details.

I then went to 34804 432nd Pl.; this is the residence where the white dog lives. This house is next to Mr. Jackman's residence and is on the way to the mailbox. I spoke with Angela Manos at the residence. She told me that she is a co-owner of the dog. She lives at this address with her boyfriend, Casey Zalomsky, they own the dog together. Angela gave me a statement about what happened.

Angela said the man and his dog walked by her house today. They were walking on the road. Angela's dogs started barking and Elijah, her child let the dogs out of the house. Angela thinks the dogs were barking at the man's dog. Angela said her dogs wanted to play with the man's dog. When Angela saw this she went out and got the dogs. She said her dogs were not growling or being mean they were just barking. Angela said the two dogs that were outside are Apollo and Harley. I asked the breed and colors of the dogs. She said Apollo is a white Bulldog and Harley is a brown boxer mixed with lab. I asked her which dog she had to grab. She said she did not have to grab any of them. She was able to yell at the dogs and they came back. I asked Angela if the man walks with a cane, she said yes he was. I asked her if she saw the man hit her dog with his cane, she said no. Angela said she yelled to the man that she was sorry the kids let the dog out. The man did not respond to her. See her statement for further details.

I filled out Dangerous Dog papers on Apollo, Angela signed the form and she was given copy. Angela asked how she could contest the designation. I told her there is a process and gave her the Declaration of Ownership and Request for a Hearing form. I filled out the top portion of the form and explained to her that she needed to fill out the rest and turn it into the Aitkin County Administrator's Office. She was also given a packet of information on the Minnesota State Statues on Regulations of Dangerous Dogs. I went through this packet with her and pointed out all of the things that would need to be done now that Apollo was designated dangerous. She said she would read through it with her boyfriend Casey.

On May 21, 2013 I was called by Sgt Heidi Lenk in reference to a case that she has been working on involving a dangerous dog. In that conversation, she asked that I check two separate locations for a silver "low-rider" Chevrolet Suburban. One of those locations was the Aitkin Trailer Court on Deer Street and the other was at 34824 432nd Pl, Aitkin, MN 56431. I was able to locate the target vehicle at the address on 432nd Pl and I notified her of this. I was informed that a search warrant was being applied for and she asked that this information be given to the County Attorney's Office so it could be placed on the warrant application. She also asked that I be the affiant for that warrant.

On May 21, 2013 at approximately 1345 hours, the Honorable John Solien signed the search warrant to

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pick up a white American Bulldog named "Apollo" from the address of 34824 432nd Pl, Aitkin, MN 56431. The warrant was for either the residence at that address or a motor vehicle located on that property. That vehicle was described in the warrant as a 1993 Silver GMC C15 vehicle belonging to Casey Alan Zalomsky with a MN license plate number 478DXZ.

When I arrived at the residence located at 34824 432nd Pl, Aitkin, MN 56431 at approximately 2:13 PM, I knocked on the patio door and was met there by Zalomsky. I also noted that vehicle was still in the driveway. After a short conversation with Zalomsky, I presented him with his copy of the search warrant and he went to get the dog, Apollo. Apollo appeared to be somewhat calm, but did growl a bit at me, but also responded to Zalomsky's commands. I filled out and gave Zalomsky his copy of the Receipt, Inventory and Return which indicates a seizure of Apollo at 2:20 PM on May 21, 2013. While doing so, he asked how to get his dog back and I told him that all of that information was on the paperwork that had been given to him. He stated that some paperwork had been given to his girlfriend at the time, but he never saw it. I then gave him a copy of the MN State Statute for Dangerous dogs. I pointed out that we were at the "Confiscation" part of the procedure and pointed this part out to him on the papers I had just given to him. I told him to read and act quickly or Apollo would be put down. I notified him that according to the paperwork I just gave him, he only had 7 days in which to reclaim Apollo and to not dawdle. He acknowledged this and took the paperwork.

The Receipt, Inventory and Return was filed with the Aitkin County Court Administration on May 21, 2013 at approximately 3:05 PM. The seized dog, Apollo, was taken to the City of Aitkin's dog pound where Police Chief Terry Thompson took control of the dog.

This ends my involvement in this case. This case is also cross referenced to ICR 13-1080.

The facts tending to establish the foregoing grounds for issuance of a search warrant are as follows:

Affiant is a Deputy with the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office and is a licensed peace officer in and for the State of Minnesota. In that capacity, Affiant has reviewed the investigative materials and report of Aitkin County Sergeant Heidi Lenk, Deputy Travis Winter, and Deputy Jon Cline. On March 28, 2013, Deputy Winter took a taped statement from Richard Jackman regarding a white American Bulldog named "Apollo" that acts aggressive towards him. Mr. Jackman stated when he walks by "Apollo" comes onto the road and growls and barks at him. Mr. Jackman estimated "Apollo" had been acting aggressively for approximately six weeks. Mr. Jackman said Apollo's owners are his neighbors, Casey Alan Zalomsky, d.o.b. 7/12/1981, and Angela Rae Manos, d.o.b. 9/27/1984, who reside at 34824 432nd Place, Aitkin, in Aitkin Township, Aitkin County. Mr. Jackman stated when he walks down the middle of the road to retrieve his mail, "Apollo" comes onto the road and tries to get behind him. Mr. Jackman stated he has used his cane to help keep "Apollo" away but has not hit or provoked "Apollo". Mr. Jackman said "Apollo" has also jumped on his dog and has knocked his dog down. Mr. Jackman stated he has spoken with Zalomsky and Manos but they did not do anything with "Apollo".

On March 29, 2013, Deputy Cline served a Notice of Determination of Potentially Dangerous Dog on Zalomsky for "Apollo". Deputy Winter later received confirmation that veterinarian Patti Zebro had microchipped "Apollo" on April 9, 2013.

On May 4, 2013, Sergeant Lenk was dispatched to Mr. Jackman's residence regarding "Apollo" having come after him again. Mr. Jackman stated he had walked down to get his mail at approximately 11:45 a.m. Mr. Jackman said "Apollo" was inside the house barking at him when he first walked by Zalmosky and Manos' residence. On his way home, he observed "Apollo" was outside and came onto the road towards him. Mr. Jackman stated "Apollo" barked aggressively at him and he was scared he was going to be bitten. Mr. Jackman hit "Apollo" on the head when he got close to him, wherein "Apollo" left him alone. Mr. Jackman stated children were yelling for "Apollo" to come back and Manos came out of the house and got "Apollo" back under control and into the house.

Sergeant Lenk proceeded to Zalomsky and Manos' residence and spoke with Manos. Manos stated she lived at the residence with her boyfriend, Zalomsky, and they are co-owners of "Apollo". Manos stated Mr. Jackman and his dog had walked by her house that day and her dogs, "Apollo" and a brown Boxer/Lab mix named "Harley", started barking. Manos said her child let "Apollo" and "Harley" out of the house. Manos believed her dogs were barking at Mr. Jackman's dog and wanted to play with his dog. Manos denied either of her dogs had growled or had been mean and had only barked. Manos denied having to grab either of her dogs and said she was able to yell for both dogs to come back. Manos knew Mr. Jackman walked with a cane but denied seeing Mr. Jackman hit "Apollo" with a cane. Manos said she yelled to Mr. Jackman she was sorry the kids had let the dog out, but Mr. Jackman did not respond. Sergeant Lenk served Manos with a Notice of Determination of Dangerous Dog for "Apollo".

On May 17, 2013, Sergeant Lenk went to Zalomsky and Manos' residence. Sergeant Lenk spoke with a female who stated Zalomsky had moved out a couple days prior and "Apollo" was no longer at the residence. Sergeant Lenk then spoke with Manos over the telephone, who stated she and Zalomsky had broken up and she was no longer an owner of "Apollo". Manos said Zalomsky was living with his exgirlfriend at the Aitkin Mobile Home Park, 39625 Deer Street, Lot 25, Aitkin, in Spencer Township, Aitkin County.

Sergeant Lenk went to the Aitkin Mobile Home Park, Lot 25, and spoke with Zalmosky. Zalomsky said he had not had a chance to do any follow-up with "Apollo" because he and Manos had split up and he has been dealing with relationship issues. Pursuant to the Dangerous Dog Notice, Zalomsky had 14 days from the date of the notice to register "Apollo" or the dog could be confiscated. Sergeant Lenk reminded Zalmosky his 14 days was up the next day. Zalmsky stated he would go in and start the process to register "Apollo". Zalomsky told Sergeant Lenk he was keeping "Apollo" in his vehicle for the time being and "Apollo" was on a leash when taken out. Zalomsky's vehicle is a 1993

Silver GMC C15 low rider vehicle, license plate number 478DXZ. Zalmosky told Sergeant Lenk he still had all of the dangerous dog paperwork of what he needed to do and would get the paperwork taken care of.

As of May 21, 2013, Zalomsky has not started the registration process for "Apollo".

On May 21, 2013, Affiant drove by Manos' residence on 432nd Place and observed Zalomsky's low rider vehicle in the driveway.

WHEREFORE, Affiant requests a search warrant be issued, commanding Larry Derksen and such other personnel assigned to assist (a) peace officer(s), of the State of Minnesota, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 8 p.m., to search the hereinbefore described premises and motor vehicle for the described property and things and to seize said property and things and keep said property and things in custody until the same be dealt with according to law.

2011 Minnesota Statutes Regulation of Dangerous Dogs

347.50 DEFINITIONS.

Subdivision 1. Terms.

For the purpose of sections <u>347.50</u> to <u>347.56</u>, the terms defined in this section have the meanings given them.

Subd. 2.Dangerous dog.

"Dangerous dog" means any dog that has:

- (1) without provocation, inflicted substantial bodily harm on a human being on public or private property;
- (2) killed a domestic animal without provocation while off the owner's property; or
- (3) been found to be potentially dangerous, and after the owner has notice that the dog is potentially dangerous, the dog aggressively bites, attacks, or endangers the safety of humans or domestic animals.

Subd. 3. Potentially dangerous dog.

"Potentially dangerous dog" means any dog that:

- (1) when unprovoked, inflicts bites on a human or domestic animal on public or private property;
- (2) when unprovoked, chases or approaches a person, including a person on a bicycle, upon the streets, sidewalks, or any public or private property, other than the dog owner's property, in an apparent attitude of attack; or
- (3) has a known propensity, tendency, or disposition to attack unprovoked, causing injury or otherwise threatening the safety of humans or domestic animals.

Subd. 4. Proper enclosure.

"Proper enclosure" means securely confined indoors or in a securely enclosed and locked pen or structure suitable to prevent the animal from escaping and providing protection from the elements for the dog. A proper enclosure does not include a porch, patio, or any part of a house, garage, or other structure that would allow the dog to exit of its own volition, or any house or structure in which windows are open or in which door or window screens are the only obstacles that prevent the dog from exiting.

Subd. 5.Owner.

"Owner" means any person, firm, corporation, organization, or department possessing, harboring, keeping, having an interest in, or having care, custody, or control of a dog.

Subd. 6. Substantial bodily harm.

"Substantial bodily harm" has the meaning given it under section 609.02, subdivision 7a.

Subd. 6a. Great bodily harm.

"Great bodily harm" has the meaning given it under section 609.02, subdivision 8.

Subd. 7. Animal control authority.

"Animal control authority" means an agency of the state, county, municipality, or other governmental subdivision of the state which is responsible for animal control operations in its jurisdiction.

Subd. 8. Provocation.

"Provocation" means an act that an adult could reasonably expect may cause a dog to attack or bite.

347.51 DANGEROUS DOGS; REGISTRATION.

Subdivision 1. Requirement.

No person may own a dangerous dog in this state unless the dog is registered as provided in this section.

Subd. 2. Registration.

An animal control authority shall issue a certificate of registration to the owner of a dangerous dog if the owner presents sufficient evidence that:

- (1) a proper enclosure exists for the dangerous dog and a posting on the premises with a clearly visible warning sign that there is a dangerous dog on the property, including a warning symbol to inform children;
- (2) a surety bond issued by a surety company authorized to conduct business in this state in a form acceptable to the animal control authority in the sum of at least \$300,000, payable to any person injured by the dangerous dog, or a policy of liability insurance

issued by an insurance company authorized to conduct business in this state in the amount of at least \$300,000, insuring the owner for any personal injuries inflicted by the dangerous dog;

- (3) the owner has paid an annual fee of not more than \$500, in addition to any regular dog licensing fees, to obtain a certificate of registration for a dangerous dog under this section; and
- (4) the owner has had microchip identification implanted in the dangerous dog as required under section 347.515.

Subd. 2a. Warning symbol.

If an animal control authority issues a certificate of registration to the owner of a dangerous dog pursuant to subdivision 2, the animal control authority must provide, for posting on the owner's property, a copy of a warning symbol to inform children that there is a dangerous dog on the property. The warning symbol must be the uniform symbol provided by the commissioner of public safety. The commissioner shall provide the number of copies of the warning symbol requested by the animal control authority and shall charge the animal control authority the actual cost of the warning symbols received. The animal control authority may charge the registrant a reasonable fee to cover its administrative costs and the cost of the warning symbol.

Subd. 3. Fee.

The animal control authority may charge the owner an annual fee, in addition to any regular dog licensing fees, to obtain a certificate of registration for a dangerous dog under this section.

Subd. 3a. Dangerous dog designation review.

Beginning six months after a dog is declared a dangerous dog, an owner may request annually that the animal control authority review the designation. The owner must provide evidence that the dog's behavior has changed due to the dog's age, neutering, environment, completion of obedience training that includes modification of aggressive behavior, or other factors. If the animal control authority finds sufficient evidence that the dog's behavior has changed, the authority may rescind the dangerous dog designation.

Subd. 4. Law enforcement; exemption.

The provisions of this section do not apply to dangerous dogs used by law enforcement officials for police work.

Subd. 5. Exemption.

Dogs may not be declared dangerous if the threat, injury, or damage was sustained by a person:

- (1) who was committing, at the time, a willful trespass or other tort upon the premises occupied by the owner of the dog;
- (2) who was provoking, tormenting, abusing, or assaulting the dog or who can be shown to have repeatedly, in the past, provoked, tormented, abused, or assaulted the dog; or

(3) who was committing or attempting to commit a crime.

Subd. 6.

[Repealed, <u>1Sp2001 c 8 art 8 s 30</u>]

Subd. 7. Tag.

A dangerous dog registered under this section must have a standardized, easily identifiable tag identifying the dog as dangerous and containing the uniform dangerous dog symbol, affixed to the dog's collar at all times.

Subd. 8. Local ordinances.

A statutory or home rule charter city, or a county, may not adopt an ordinance regulating dangerous or potentially dangerous dogs based solely on the specific breed of the dog. Ordinances inconsistent with this subdivision are void.

Subd. 9. Contracted services.

An animal control authority may contract with another political subdivision or other person to provide the services required under sections 347.50 to 347.565. Notwithstanding any contract entered into under this subdivision, all fees collected under sections 347.50 to 347.54 shall be paid to the animal control authority and all certificates of registration must be issued in the name of the animal control authority.

347.515 MICROCHIP IDENTIFICATION.

The owner of a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog must have a microchip implanted in the dog for identification, and the name of the microchip manufacturer and identification number of the microchip must be provided to the animal control authority. If the microchip is not implanted by the owner, it may be implanted by the animal control authority. In either case, all costs related to purchase and implantation of the microchip must be borne by the dog's owner.

347.52 DANGEROUS DOGS; REQUIREMENTS.

- (a) An owner of a dangerous dog shall keep the dog, while on the owner's property, in a proper enclosure. If the dog is outside the proper enclosure, the dog must be muzzled and restrained by a substantial chain or leash and under the physical restraint of a responsible person. The muzzle must be made in a manner that will prevent the dog from biting any person or animal but that will not cause injury to the dog or interfere with its vision or respiration.
- (b) An owner of a dangerous dog must renew the registration of the dog annually until the dog is deceased. If the dog is removed from the jurisdiction, it must be registered as a dangerous dog in its new jurisdiction.
- (c) An owner of a dangerous dog must notify the animal control authority in writing of the death of the dog or its transfer to a new location where the dog will reside within 30 days of the death or transfer, and must, if requested by the animal control authority, execute an affidavit under oath setting forth either the circumstances of the dog's death and disposition or the complete name, address, and telephone number of the person to whom the dog has been transferred or the address where the dog has been relocated.
- (d) An animal control authority shall require a dangerous dog to be sterilized at the owner's expense. If the owner does not have the animal sterilized within 30 days, the animal control authority shall seize the dog and have it sterilized at the owner's expense.
- (e) A person who owns a dangerous dog and who rents property from another where the dog will reside must disclose to the property owner prior to entering the lease agreement and at the time of any lease renewal that the person owns a dangerous dog that will reside at the property.
- (f) A person who transfers ownership of a dangerous dog must notify the new owner that the animal control authority has identified the dog as dangerous. The current owner must also notify the animal control authority in writing of the transfer of ownership and provide the animal control authority with the new owner's name, address, and telephone number.

347.53 POTENTIALLY DANGEROUS AND DANGEROUS DOGS.

Any statutory or home rule charter city, or any county, may regulate potentially dangerous and dangerous dogs. Except as provided in section 347.51, subdivision 8, nothing in sections 347.50 to 347.565 limits any restrictions that the local jurisdictions may place on owners of potentially dangerous or dangerous dogs.

347.54 CONFISCATION.

Subdivision 1. Seizure.

- (a) The animal control authority having jurisdiction shall immediately seize any dangerous dog if:
- (1) after 14 days after the owner has notice that the dog is dangerous, the dog is not validly registered under section 347.51;
- (2) after 14 days after the owner has notice that the dog is dangerous, the owner does not secure the proper liability insurance or surety coverage as required under section 347.51, subdivision 2;
- (3) the dog is not maintained in the proper enclosure;
- (4) the dog is outside the proper enclosure and not under physical restraint of a responsible person as required under section 347.52; or
- (5) the dog is not sterilized within 30 days, pursuant to section 347.52, paragraph (d).
- (b) If an owner of a dog is convicted of a crime for which the dog was originally seized, the court may order that the dog be confiscated and destroyed in a proper and humane manner, and that the owner pay the costs incurred in confiscating, confining, and destroying the dog.

Subd. 2. Reclaimed.

A dangerous dog seized under subdivision 1 may be reclaimed by the owner of the dog upon payment of impounding and boarding fees, and presenting proof to the appropriate animal control authority that the requirements of sections 347.51 and 347.52 will be met. A dog not reclaimed under this subdivision within seven days may be disposed of as provided under section 35.71, subdivision 3, and the owner is liable to the animal control authority for costs incurred in confining and disposing of the dog.

Subd. 3. Subsequent offenses; seizure.

If a person has been convicted of a misdemeanor for violating a provision of section 347.51, 347.515, or 347.52, and the person is charged with a subsequent violation relating to the same dog, the dog must be seized by the animal control authority having jurisdiction. If the owner is convicted of the crime for which the dog was seized, the court shall order that the dog be destroyed in a proper and humane manner and the owner pay the cost of confining and destroying the animal. If the owner is not convicted and the dog is not reclaimed by the owner within seven days after the owner has been notified that the dog may be reclaimed, the dog may be disposed of as provided under section 35.71, subdivision 3.

347.541 DISPOSITION OF SEIZED ANIMALS.

Subdivision 1. Hearing.

The owner of any dog declared dangerous has the right to a hearing by an impartial hearing officer.

Subd. 2. Security.

A person claiming an interest in a seized dog may prevent disposition of the dog by posting security in an amount sufficient to provide for the dog's actual cost of care and keeping. The security must be posted within seven days of the seizure inclusive of the date of the seizure.

Subd. 3. Notice.

The authority declaring the dog dangerous shall give notice of this section by delivering or mailing it to the owner of the dog, or by posting a copy of it at the place where the dog is kept, or by delivering it to a person residing on the property, and telephoning, if possible. The notice must include:

- (1) a description of the seized dog; the authority for and purpose of the dangerous dog declaration and seizure; the time, place, and circumstances under which the dog was declared dangerous; and the telephone number and contact person where the dog is kept; (2) a statement that the owner of the dog may request a hearing concerning the dangerous dog declaration and, if applicable, prior potentially dangerous dog declarations for the dog, and that failure to do so within 14 days of the date of the notice will terminate the
- owner's right to a hearing under this section;
 (3) a statement that if an appeal request is made within 14 days of the notice, the owner must immediately comply with the requirements of section 347.52, paragraphs (a) and

(c), and until such time as the hearing officer issues an opinion;

(4) a statement that if the hearing officer affirms the dangerous dog declaration, the owner will have 14 days from receipt of that decision to comply with all other requirements of sections 347.51, 347.515, and 347.52;

(5) a form to request a hearing under this subdivision; and

(6) a statement that all actual costs of the care, keeping, and disposition of the dog are the responsibility of the person claiming an interest in the dog, except to the extent that a court or hearing officer finds that the seizure or impoundment was not substantially justified by law.

Subd. 4. Right to hearing.

Any hearing must be held within 14 days of the request to determine the validity of the dangerous dog declaration. The hearing officer must be an impartial employee of the local government or an impartial person retained by the local government to conduct the

hearing. In the event that the dangerous dog declaration is upheld by the hearing officer, actual expenses of the hearing up to a maximum of \$1,000 will be the responsibility of the dog's owner. The hearing officer shall issue a decision on the matter within ten days after the hearing. The decision must be delivered to the dog's owner by hand delivery or registered mail as soon as practical and a copy must be provided to the animal control authority.

347.542 RESTRICTIONS.

Subdivision 1. Dog ownership prohibited.

Except as provided in subdivision 3, no person may own a dog if the person has: (1) been convicted of a third or subsequent violation of section 347.51, 347.515, or 347.52:

- (2) been convicted of a violation under section 609.205, clause (4);
- (3) been convicted of a gross misdemeanor under section 609.226, subdivision 1;
- (4) been convicted of a violation under section 609.226, subdivision 2; or
- (5) had a dog ordered destroyed under section <u>347.56</u> and been convicted of one or more violations of section <u>347.51</u>, <u>346.515</u>, <u>347.52</u>, or <u>609.226</u>, subdivision 2.

Subd. 2. Household members.

If any member of a household is prohibited from owning a dog in subdivision 1, unless specifically approved with or without restrictions by an animal control authority, no person in the household is permitted to own a dog.

Subd. 3. Dog ownership prohibition review.

Beginning three years after a conviction under subdivision 1 that prohibits a person from owning a dog, and annually thereafter, the person may request that the animal control authority review the prohibition. The animal control authority may consider such facts as the seriousness of the violation or violations that led to the prohibition, any criminal convictions, or other facts that the animal control authority deems appropriate. The animal control authority may rescind the prohibition entirely or rescind it with limitations. The animal control authority also may establish conditions a person must meet before the prohibition is rescinded, including, but not limited to, successfully completing dog training or dog handling courses. If the animal control authority rescinds a person's prohibition and the person subsequently fails to comply with any limitations imposed by the animal control authority or the person is convicted of any animal violation involving unprovoked bites or dog attacks, the animal control authority may permanently prohibit the person from owning a dog in this state.

347.55 PENALTY.

- (a) A person who violates a provision of section <u>347.51</u>, <u>347.515</u>, or <u>347.52</u> is guilty of a misdemeanor.
- (b) It is a misdemeanor to remove a microchip from a dangerous or potentially dangerous dog, to fail to renew the registration of a dangerous dog, to fail to account for a dangerous dog's death or change of location where the dog will reside, to sign a false affidavit with respect to a dangerous dog's death or change of location where the dog will reside, or to fail to disclose ownership of a dangerous dog to a property owner from whom the person rents property.
- (c) A person who is convicted of a second or subsequent violation of paragraph (a) or (b) is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- (d) An owner who violates section <u>347.542</u>, <u>subdivision 1</u>, is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.
- (e) Any household member who knowingly violates section <u>347.542</u>, <u>subdivision 2</u>, is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

347.56 DESTRUCTION OF DOG IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES.

Subdivision 1. Circumstances.

Notwithstanding sections 347.51 to 347.55, a dog may be destroyed in a proper and humane manner by the animal control authority if the dog:

- (1) inflicted substantial or great bodily harm on a human on public or private property without provocation;
- (2) inflicted multiple bites on a human on public or private property without provocation;
- (3) bit multiple human victims on public or private property in the same attack without provocation; or
- (4) bit a human on public or private property without provocation in an attack where more than one dog participated in the attack.

Subd. 2. Hearing.

The animal control authority may not destroy the dog until the dog owner has had the opportunity for a hearing before an impartial decision maker. The definitions in section 347.50 and the exemptions under section 347.51, subdivision 5, apply to this section.

347.565 APPLICABILITY.

Sections <u>347.50</u> to <u>347.56</u> must be enforced by animal control authorities or law enforcement agencies, whether or not these sections have been adopted into local ordinance.


Attached is a copy of a proposal from Arrowhead Regional Development Commission (ARDC) for the updating of Aitkin County's Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. If you recall, in October of 2012, the Aitkin County Board of Commissioners passed a resolution to enter into a sub-grant agreement with the Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management in the Minnesota Department of Public Safety for grant funding to help pay for this service. That grant will be used to pay for this plan update, along with some "in-kind" contribution from the participating cities and Aitkin County.

SUMMARY

The Arrowhead Regional Development Commission (ARDC) proposes to provide professional services to Aitkin County to update the Aitkin County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan for FEMA approval. The County is required by the State of Minnesota Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) to update its plan every five years. In the spring of 2013 Aitkin County was awarded a planning grant from HSEM / FEMA to proceed with hiring a contractor for the update of the plan.

The following proposal outlines how ARDC will work in cooperation with the University of Minnesota – Geographic Information Sciences Laboratory (UMD-GISL) to update the multi- hazard mitigation plan.

ARDC

The Arrowhead Regional Development Commission (ARDC) is a multi-disciplined planning and development organization whose jurisdiction encompasses the Northeast Minnesota counties of Aitkin, Carlton, Cook, Itasca, Koochiching, Lake, and St. Louis.

The mission of ARDC is to serve the people of the Arrowhead Region by providing local units of government and citizens groups a means to work cooperatively in identifying needs, solving problems and fostering local leadership.

This project is proposed by ARDC's Regional Planning Division. The professional planning staff for this project will be led by Senior Planner Bonnie Hundrieser.

BACKGROUND

ARDC has a successful record of providing professional planning services in the areas of emergency management and hazard mitigation to communities in northeast Minnesota, including development of Hazard Mitigation Plans for each of the seven counties in the ARDC service area (2004-2008), update of the Lake County Community Wildfire Protection Plan (2011), and administration of two FEMA Pre-Disaster Mitigation grant programs for installation of external wildfire sprinkler systems in high-risk wildfire areas of St. Louis and Lake Counties (2009-2011). ARDC wrote the 2005 hazard mitigation plan for Aitkin County and is prepared to do the five year update using current resources required by FEMA and HSEM.

PROJECT TEAM

ARDC's Regional Planning Division: This work will be led by Bonnie Hundrieser, ARDC Senior Planner. Hundrieser will be responsible for project coordination, plan research, writing, meeting organization, facilitation, and documentation. Hundrieser has worked on the implementation of two

FEMA pre-disaster mitigation projects for the installation of external wildfire sprinkler systems in highrisk wildfire areas of St. Louis and Lake County. She has also taken several FEMA / HSEM trainings and courses for hazard mitigation planning and development of Hazard Mitigation Grant Program applications.

Andy Hubley, Regional Planning Division Director will provide project oversight and guidance. Hubley has nearly 16 years of planning and planning project management experience. Hubley is certified by the American Institute of Certified Planners.

Liz Sarabia, Regional Planning Division Secretary will provide project support (final document layout, design & printing and CD creation).

University of Minnesota – Geographic Information Sciences Laboratory (UMD-GISL): UMD GISL will work under subcontract to ARDC to develop the GIS-related requirements of the plan (HAZUS-MH and geospatial mapping will be used to develop the County Profile and Risk Assessment data). This work will be led by Stacey Stark, GISL Director, who will coordinate tasks with other GISL staff and students.

Aitkin County: Throughout the project process, ARDC and UMD-GISL will work closely with the Aitkin County Emergency Manager Sheriff Scott Turner, who will lead the mitigation plan update process for Aitkin County and oversee work done by ARDC. Turner will form a Mitigation Plan Update Committee that represents county departments and participating cities. ARDC will work with the Emergency Manager and the Mitigation Plan Update Committee through each phase of the plan update to ensure support of the planning process. ARDC will provide regular correspondence to keep the committee abreast of the status of the Aitkin County hazard mitigation planning process. This will be accomplished by initiating telephone calls, e-mails, interviews, and a limited number of additional meetings, as necessary.

PROJECT APPROACH / SCOPE OF WORK

This will be a multi-jurisdictional plan that includes the following cities: Aitkin, Hill City, McGregor, McGrath, Palisade and Tamarack.

The hazards that will be addressed in the plan update include: Winter Storms, Ice Storms, Thunderstorms, Hailstorms, Lightning, Tornadoes, Windstorms, Extreme Temperatures, Flooding, Drought, Wildfire, Infectious Diseases, Earthquake, Solar Storm, Structural Fires, Hazardous Materials, Water Supply Contamination, Wastewater System Failure, Dam Failure, and Radiological Terrorism.

As per FEMA requirements, the plan will include the following components:

- 1) **Planning Process:** This section of the plan will document the planning process used to develop the plan, including how it was prepared, who was involved in the process, and how the public was involved.
- 2) Risk Assessment: This section of the plan provides the factual basis for activities proposed in the strategy to reduce losses from identified losses. The plan will include a description of the type, location, and extent of all natural hazards that can affect the communities participating in the plan process.

- 3) Mitigation Strategy: This section provides the community's blueprint for reducing the potential losses identified in the risk assessment. This section of the plan will include a description of mitigation goals to reduce or avoid long-term vulnerabilities to the identified hazards.
- **4) Plan Maintenance Procedure:** This section of the plan will describe the plan maintenance process including the method and schedule of monitoring, evaluating, and updating the mitigation plan within a five-year cycle.
- **5) Plan Adoption:** This section of the plan will include documentation that the governing body of the community requesting the approval of the plan has formally adopted the plan.

To work effectively with the Aitkin County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan Update Committee to complete identified plan requirements, ARDC will follow the Scope of Work as per Aitkin County's Hazard Mitigation Assistance Planning Grant Application to HSEM. (See Attachment A, Section C "Scope of Work" pages A-5 to A-11).

ARDC will be involved with Tasks 1-5 as detailed by the above-noted Scope of Work. Below is a summary chart of these tasks and associated time anticipated for each:

ARDC and UMD-GISL Collaboration

To complete the Aitkin County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHMP), ARDC proposes to work in collaboration with the University of Minnesota – Geographic Information Sciences Laboratory (UMD-GISL) to update the MHMP as per requirements by FEMA. In general, UMD would provide most of the content for sections 3 and 4 and rough formatting, but all the final formatting and editing would be done by ARDC to pull the whole document together.

Public Involvement:

ARDC will ensure that outreach to and engagement of the public will be done throughout the plan update process to inform the public, answer questions, and capture their comments and concerns. As per the Attached Scope of Work (page A-5), ARDC will conduct a minimum of 5 meetings on the hazard mitigation planning process. These briefings will occur throughout the duration of the project at key points of the plan update.

Project Duration:

As per the Attached Scope of Work (page A-11), total project duration is expected to be 18 months. State funding to Aitkin County for this project expires February 15, 2016. Any additional time that may be required by ARDC or UMD-GISL for project completion beyond 18 months will be approved with written agreement by Aitkin County Sheriff Scott Turner.

BUDGET

As consultant to Aitkin County, ARDC will gather data for the plan, facilitate meetings, work with UMD-GISL to develop HAZUS-MH and GIS based loss estimates and revise the plan. ARDC will be involved with Tasks 1-5 as detailed in Attachment A, Section C "Scope of Work". **ARDC consultant fees are estimated to a maximum of \$25,500.00 for contractual planning services.** Aitkin County has \$25,500 for these services included in their approved grant contract with the State of Minnesota (see Attachment A, page A-12).

Task 1: Organize Resources

The Emergency Manager for Aitkin County will lead the mitigation plan update process. A Mitigation Plan Update Committee will be convened that represents county departments and participating cities. The Emergency Manager and the Committee will be involved in all phases of updating the plan and coordinating the review with HSEM and FEMA. Aitkin County will procure the services of a consultant to assist in facilitating meetings, updating the risk assessment using HAZUS-MH and overall revision of the plan. The county will use its procedures to follow 44 CFR §13.36 when procuring the services of the consultant.

Subtask 1.1: Coordinate with Mitigation Plan Update Committee: The consultant will work with the Mitigation Plan Update Committee. Coordinating with this core group is important to ensure support of the planning process and implementation once the plan is completed. The planning committee will further coordinate with non-profit organizations, state, regional, and local government representatives, businesses and development organizations, federal representatives, elected officials, academic officials, and individuals from neighboring jurisdictions.

Subtask 1.2: Update Process and Identify Hazards

The consultant will start to collect data such as the current mitigation plan, updated disaster history, and relevant plans and ordinances before the first formal meeting convenes. The consultant will develop issues and points of discussion from the information it has collected. After reviewing the information, The consultant will prepare an agenda to be sent to the members before the first meeting. The meetings will address the following key points:

- ☐ Address FEMA's requirements for updating mitigation plans; as identified in 44 CFR 201.6(d)(3)
- ☐ Identify members' contribution to the planning process;
- □ Address preliminary goals and objectives;
- ☐ Identify (and debrief) meetings with key community stakeholders and any other bodies that may seem appropriate;
 ☐ Distribute questionnaires that will assist in identifying resources that will be needed for successful completion of the project;
- \square Highlight the progress-to-date and the schedule for the remainder of the planning process, and;
- ☐ Solicit input from members.

The consultant will conduct five (5) meetings on the hazard mitigation planning update process. These briefings will occur throughout the duration of the project.

Meeting 1: In the kickoff meeting, the consultant will describe the rationale behind the mitigation program and answer questions from participants. This meeting will also include a discussion of roles, responsibilities, decision-making processes, administrative procedures, and communication strategies...

Meeting 2: At this meeting, the consultant will present a local map with the HAZUS-MH critical facilities plotted. This map will be used to elicit better local information from the planning committee. The committee will also reprioritize the hazards it feels most affects the community and profile the hazards to model with HAZUS-MH including floods and hazardous materials spills.

Meeting 3: Meeting 3 is typically set as the public meeting and often held in conjunction with Meeting 2 or 4. The consultant will present the results of the modeling and risk assessment analyses and will answer questions from the planning committee and the public.

Meeting 4: In this meeting, the consultant will lead the committee in a brainstorming session to list and prioritize mitigation strategies that need to be updated or added.

Meeting 5: In meeting 5, the planning committee will meet to review and revise the draft plan before adopting it.

To facilitate continual participation of the Aitkin County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee, the consultant will provide regular correspondence to keep the committee abreast of the status of the Aitkin County hazard mitigation planning process. This will be accomplished by initiating telephone conference calls, e-mails, interviews, and a limited number of additional meetings, as necessary.

Subtask 1.3: Public Involvement

During the planning/update process, the county will conduct two public forums and several public outreach activities

to solicit public involvement. Publ. meetings will be announced using a variety conduct two presentations in a public meeting and will assist in answering questions. The first will provide a briefing of the County's updated risk assessment findings and present the first draft of the updated plan (i.e. Meeting 3). The second meeting will present the proposed mitigation goals, objectives and strategies (i.e. Meeting 5). These public meetings will be held immediately following or in conjunction with the County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee briefings/meetings. Public and key agency involvement at this meeting will provide the consultant and the County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee with different points of view about the needs of the community and help build consensus for the plan, especially among the approving agencies.

Additionally, the consultant will provide support and advice to Airkin County's efforts to inform the public about the opportunity to participate in the update process. These efforts may include:

QAdvertisements in local newspapers;

DPreparation of public service announcements;

Distribution of brochures, newsletters and fliers, and;

DPosting information and announcements on the county web site.

Methods of capturing the public's comments and concerns may include recording or documenting the meetings, providing comment cards, use of easel charts to record comments during question and answer sessions, and minutes summarizing the proceedings.

Projected Completion: 9 Months

Task 2: Assess Risks/GIS Analysis

A community's hazard risk assessment is a critical document that defines a community's strategic common operational picture to mitigate, as well as prepare, protect, respond, and recover to emergencies and disasters. The consultant also recognizes that a community's vulnerability assessment and analysis is a definitive measure of the risk associated with each individual hazard. Therefore, in addition to updating the Aitkin County's multi-hazard risk assessment for the mitigation plan, the consultant will develop planning considerations that Aitkin County can integrate into other planning doctrine. This approach will serve as the foundation for other emergency management initiatives and create increased programmatic efficiencies and a common operational picture. The consultant will also assist the community with updating the risk assessment by using HAZUS-MH as an added risk assessment tool. The consultant's methodology should ensure:

- ☐ Uniformity between hazard categories.
- ☐ Utilizes empirical values that can be universally applied to all communities, facilities and systems.
- ☐ Employs complex GIS modeling and analysis of probable scenarios to provide planning considerations of social, political and physical impacts.
- ☐ Grants the flexibility needed to accurately and systematically integrate the vulnerability assessments of critical assets.
- ☐ Provides consistency between the State's approach while addressing the unique characteristics and attributes of the Aitkin County and its cities.

As part of the community's overall risk assessment, the consultant will provide an updated analysis of the natural, technological, and political hazard categories by elaborating upon and defining the specific types of hazards; identifying recent events that have occurred locally and/or regionally; updating the hazard profiles, parameters, and characteristics; assessing possible vulnerabilities not addressed in the previous version; determining probable scenarios; and modeling select hazards.

Subtask 2.1: Update & Identify Hazards

The consultant will help the county's planning committee identify and review all of the hazards that might affect the community, and will narrow the list to the hazards that most likely will impact the community. There is no one source for indentifying which applicable hazards may affect the community. The following methods will be used where applicable.

The consultant will obtain this information through various avenues, including, but not limited to:

- (1) Research of historical documents and data: by accessing newspapers, historical societies, database searches, etc, the consultant will gather records that may contain dates, magnitude of the events, damage, and further evidence of the past natural disasters in the community.
- (2) Review of existing authorities, ordinances, plans and reports: To ensure Aitkin County is covering all of the

possible hazards, the consultant will collect and review plans and documents that and have information on multihazard planning. Transportation, environmental, dam, or public works reports or plans are examples of documents HAT A that may contain relevant information. These documents will be reviewed to identify a list of disasters and potential issues that have occurred in the past. In addition, local comprehensive plans, land use plans, capital improvement plans, as well as building codes, land development regulations, and flood ordinances will be reviewed to identify hazard provisions that indicate the presence of local hazards.

(3) Coordination with emergency managers and key stakeholders: In close coordination with the Aitkin County's staff and committee, the consultant will make efforts to coordinate with the local, state, and federal governments to obtain hazard information, development trends, known vulnerabilities, and past experiences mitigating, responding, and recovering from disasters. Coordination efforts will include:

☐ Interview pre-identified local officials and pre-identified FEMA officials

☐ Contacting other resources such as Natural Hazards Center, Hazard Disaster Center, National Weather Service, Association of State Floodplain Managers, International Association of Emergency Managers, etc.

Coordination efforts will be accomplished using the following methods:

Documented telephone calls and interviews

☐ B-mail correspondence

☐ Meetings (if necessary) - in conjunction with previously scheduled client meetings - with key stakeholder representatives

Subtask 2.2: Profile Hazard Events

Utilizing the inventory of local hazards provided by Aitkin County and other relevant sources, the consultant will assist in re-identifying and updating procedures and techniques of the county to quantify all-hazard events depending on their location, duration, intensity, and severity. Because each hazard type has unique characteristics that can impact Aitkin County in different ways based on geography, development, population distribution, economic significance, and systematic functions, the information gathered in this step will help determine the assets in the hazard areas that will be inventoried in the next task.

2.2.1 Obtain and create a base map

The consultant will identify and collect the best available base map information to show the areas that are subject to various hazards. The GIS base map data from the county will be used in conjunction with regional and statewide data. The base map will be as complete, accurate, and current as possible and will use infrastructure data such as roads and buildings drawn on photo information in geographic relationship (to scale) with measurable horizontal distances. The county map will provide a common frame of reference to show human and structural assets that should be inventoried.

2.2.2 Obtain hazard event profile information

Using the information obtained in the previous tasks, the consultant will determine the return frequency and natural hazard occurrences for each hazard. The hazard frequency will be based on the most commonly available information for a particular hazard. A more comprehensive hazard profile that considers all possible events, such as floods with different probabilities, may also be included for specific hazards.

2.2.3 Record hazard event profile information

The consultant will record the information for each hazard profile. The task will include documenting the source of the various maps such as the Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs), revisions to the risk assessment matrix, and recent natural hazard occurrences.

Subtask 2.3: Inventory Assets

Using GIS data management and analysis, an inventory of the Aitkin County's assets will be developed based on the five categories defined in DHS/FEMA protocol. This inventory of assets will assist in identifying areas that are subject to the various natural hazards in the subject area. These five categories consist of:

An initial inventory will use the baseline data contained in HAZUS-MH and supplemented by GIS data provided by the Aifkin County. The effort includes developing and mapping a general inventory of assets in the community. The objective of the risk methodology is to devise a method to compare and evaluate which hazards are the greatest threats to Airkin County. 2.4.1 Integrate with Significant Future Development Trends and Considerations	

Future development trends and special considerations (i.e. historical property, environmentally sensitive areas, etc.) can have a significant impact on a community's risk to hazards. The impact of these trends and special considerations on the community's risk is directly proportional to the size of the community, community values, and the significance of the development trend or special consideration. With input from members of the Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee and key stakeholders, the consultant will analyze the affect of any significant regional future development trends and special considerations identified by Aitkin County to determine their positive or negative impacts on the hazard profiles, inventoried assets, or the projected loss.

2.4.2 First Draft of Updated Risk Assessment Section of Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan

The consultant will provide Airkin County a draft submittal of the All-Hazard Risk Assessment Report for review and comment. The consultant will schedule and conduct a meeting with the County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee and general public to provide a briefing of the updated risk assessment in order to build consensus and buy-in from the group. Once these documents are reviewed, we will incorporate changes into the final All-Hazard Risk Assessment Report. A copy of the report will also be provided to the SHMO to be incorporated into the statewide risk assessment. The report will be included in the next phase of the hazard mitigation planning process. The consultant will provide Airkin County with all non-proprietary HAZUS-MH and GIS products.

Projected Completion: 6 Months

Task 3: Prioritize Mitigation Actions

Effective mitigation actions and preparedness activities are complementary of one another and provide a holistic approach that aligns multiple state and federal directives and funding. The strategies proposed by the consultant will ensure compliance with DMA 2000. The consultant will provide technical support to the six hazard mitigation and preparedness categories, as defined by FEMA: prevention, property protection, public education and awareness, natural resources protection, emergency services and structural projects.

Identifying and prioritizing mitigation actions are the fundamental components of a Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan. In the previous tasks, hazards were redefined, vulnerabilities were reassessed, and the losses were estimated. Development of a prioritized and updated list of mitigation actions will be developed that will reduce future risks and losses. This task will assist the consultant in the following:

- ☐ Update goals and objectives
- ☐ Identify and reevaluate mitigation actions
- ☐ Update the capabilities assessment
- ☐ Update mitigation strategies

Subtask 3.1: Review and Analyze the Results of the Hazard Profiles and Loss Estimation

Information revealed in the updated hazard profiles and loss estimation will be used to develop clear mitigation goals. The consultant will attend the planning meeting and review the results of the previous risk assessment planning process that outlined the updated hazard profiles with details on the causes of hazards, the likelihood of occurrence, the potential severity, and the extent of areas affected. The consultant will review the loss estimation dollar amount of damages for particular hazard events, as well as related economic information like business interruption and revenue losses

3.1.1 Review the finding of the county's risk assessment

The consultant will participate in a workshop to review the risk assessment report and composite maps. The emphasis of the workshop is knowledge and understanding of the causes of the hazards and better preparation for determining mitigation actions.

3.1.2 Develop a list of problem statements based on these findings

The county planning committee will take the results of the risk assessment and develop a problem statement to clearly point out which hazard to address first.

Subtask 3.2: Review the Mitigation Plan and Objectives

A multi-hazard mitigation plan defines mitigation goals and objectives for the community. Based upon the hazard profiles, hazard loss, vulnerability and risk assessment, the local planning committee will update mitigation goals that articulate the county's desire to protect people and structures, reduce the cost of disaster response and recovery, and minimize disruption to the community following a disaster.

The consultant will prepare the updated Mitigation Goals and Objectives as identified by Airkin County. Additionally, The consultant will schedule and conduct a meeting to review draft mitigation goals and objectives with the County Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee and the general public. The consultant will solicit feedback in order to gain buy-in and consensus. The local planning committee, with assistance from the contractor, will also update mitigation objectives that define strategies or implementation steps to attain the identified goals.

	Subtask 3.3: Identification and Reprioritization of Mitigation Actions Mitigation actions consistent with the goals and objectives that were previously defined will be reevaluated. The hazard mitigation plan defines the action plan to reduce community loss from future hazard events. Geocaching Challenge Update



As you are aware, Geocaching is an outdoor oriented game, similar to a treasure hunt. Participants use a GPS to find hidden caches of trinkets. In 2012, Aitkin County Land Department unveiled a countywide geocaching challenge, timed with the grand opening of the Northwoods ATV trail. Twenty caches (20) were placed in trail towns and county recreational facilities. The participation in 2013 was higher than expected with over 440 individual caches/treasure boxes found; 13 individuals even completed the challenge. The overall response was very positive prompting ACLD to consider a second challenge.

The Aitkin County Board, Economic Development, and Aitkin County Trail Towns were supportive of this effort. In order to expand this challenge in 2013, ACLD has enlisted additional groups to participate. These groups include Aitkin County 4H clubs, Girl Scout Troop 52, and Sentence to Serve. Four new caches will be placed this year along with re-hiding the existing previous twenty for a total of twenty four (24) caches. Materials are being recycled and remaining monies from 2012 are being used to fund the majority of the project. An additional \$200 infusion has been obtained from the tourism fund.

Last year's caches featured playing cards with historical photos as provided by the Aitkin County Historical Society. This year's challenge will feature wooden nickels each with a different tree stamp on the back (see image examples below). Participants in the challenge will collect wooden nickels from each cache. The geocaching team will be awarded a wooden frame to display the entire collection.

Additional ideas that are in the planning stage include using the wooden nickels as an incentive to visit area towns; possibly entitling the bearer to additional rewards. Aitkin County Trail towns are considering their options at this time.

The 2013 Geocaching Challenge is planned to go live on the first day of summer, which is June 21, 2013.

Re: Billboard Valuation

Aitkin County has many billboards along our major highways. Billboards are large roadside signs that advertise some product or service. They are often large, steel-frame structures that are built by professional outdoor advertising companies. The property owner typically receives regular income from the company in exchange for the use of the land.

Currently, billboards are not being valued, classified, or taxed in many Minnesota counties. The Minnesota Department of Revenue is currently working on a bulletin that will advise assessors on how to value and classify billboards. They wish to develop statewide consistency.

We are planning to locate the major billboards in the County this summer. Then, we will proceed to contact the owners and ask for details of their lease agreements. Lease details, including income information, is protected private data and will only be used to develop market rates for an income approach to value. Owners may refuse to provide this data but without their help, the development of reasonable estimated values will be difficult.

The Uniform Standards of Professional Appraisal Practice (USPAP) published by The Appraisal Foundation requires that mass appraisers (aka assessors) must "collect, verify, and analyze such data as are necessary and appropriate to develop" items such as "value by capitalization of income or potential earnings-i.e., rentals, expenses, interest rates, capitalization rates, and vacancy data". While we need to respect the privacy of individuals, we are also required to adhere to the USPAP.

We plan to allow plenty of time for owners to voice their questions and concerns to us prior to the finalization of values in March 2014. Please contact me with any questions.
