MEDICAL EXAMINER CONTRACT AGREEMENT

Agreement entered into this 14th day of October, by and between the County of Aitkin, a political subdivision of the State of Minnesota, and River Valley Forensic Services, P.A. for the services of Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D. as Medical Examiner of Aitkin County.

I. Relationship of Parties

- A. Pursuant to County Board action that took place on October 14, 2025 and the authority of Minnesota Statutes Ch. 390, the board of Aitkin County commissioners designates Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., as Medical Examiner for Aitkin County, hereinafter "the Medical Examiner."
- B. It is agreed that nothing contained in the Agreement is intended or should be construed as creating the relationship of co-partners, joint ventures or an association or an employer/employee relationship between Aitkin County and Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., River Valley Forensic Services, P.A., or their employees or designee. River Valley Forensic Services, P.A. is an independent contractor, and neither River Valley Forensic Services, P.A. it, its officers, agents or employees shall be considered agents or representatives of the County. The County is interested only in the results to be achieved. The manner and means of conducting the works are under the control of the Medical Examiner, except to the extent they are limited by statute or regulation and the express terms of this Agreement. None of the benefits provided by the County to its employees, including, without limitation, unemployment insurance, workers' compensation insurance, retirement and deferred compensation plans, vacation and sick leave, are available from the County to the Medical Examiner, River Valley Forensic Services, P.A., or the employees, agents or contractors of either. No civil service status shall attach to the Medical Examiner, Medical Staff, agent of contractors of the Medical Examiner or River Valley Forensic Services, P.A. and the County shall make no deductions from sums payable under the terms of this Agreement for state or federal income taxes, FICA, PERA or other payroll type deductions which are associated with an employer-employee relationship.

II. Personnel

- A. The Medical Examiner will designate Dr. Kirstin Howell, Dr. Victor Froloff and Dr. Butch Huston to assist in performing the contract and shall be under the control and supervision of the Medical Examiner. Dr. Howell, Dr. Froloff and Dr. Huston shall not be considered employees of the County, nor have a contractual relationship with the County. The County shall be notified prior to the effective date of any changes thereto.
- B. The non-medical personnel necessary to support the Medical Examiner in

the performance of his duties under this Agreement shall be provided through the County Sheriff's Department. The compensation, benefits, and other terms of employment of these non-medical personnel shall be determined and paid solely by the county.

III. Scope of Duties

- A. The Medical Examiner shall be responsible for conducting a modern medico-legal investigative system for Aitkin County applying the standards of the National Association of Medical Examiners, as they may be amended from time to time. The Medical Examiner shall periodically consult with the County Attorney's Office, police agencies, and others concerned with forensic pathology to review procedures and formats for preparing medical reports and protocols. The Medical Examiner shall perform all duties imposed by Minnesota Statutes Chapter 390, as well as the duties imposed by other statutes applicable to the Medical Examiner's activities. The Medical Examiner shall testify, as required, at inquests, hearings and trials.
- B. The Medical Examiner shall be responsible for the final determination of the cause and manner of death, and the signing of certificates attesting the cause and manner of death. During the temporary absence of the Medical Examiner, a qualified person designated by the Medical Examiner may make the final determination of death, and sign a certificate attesting to the cause and manner of death.
- C. The Medical Examiner shall be entitled to perform other gainful activities which do not interfere with the performance of her duties hereunder.

IV. Compensation

- A. All payments made under this agreement for services rendered by or at the designation of Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., shall be made to River Valley Forensic Services, P.A.
- B. The County will be responsible for the payment for each complete autopsy or external examination performed by Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., or her assistants, as the Medical Examiner pursuant to this agreement and billed to Aitkin County upon completion of each examination in keeping with the past practice of the County Medical Examiner's Office.
- C. Compensation for the services under this contract shall be \$250.00/month plus the following on a per service basis: (1) complete forensic autopsy with basic toxicology, at approximately \$3,000, and (2) external examination with basic toxicology at approximately \$1000.

D. Additionally, the County will be responsible for court related preparation / consultation and out of office charges, billed on an hourly basis of \$300/hr., including travel to and from Aitkin County in order to provide testimony in legal proceedings arising out of the duties of the Medical Examiner.

V. Facilities

The facility, together with all the necessary equipment, the supplies, shall be the responsibility of Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D. It is represented by Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., and understood by the County that Ramsey County Morgue shall be available to Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., for the performance of this agreement.

VI. Insurance and Indemnification

- A. River Valley Forensic Services, P.A. agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the County of Aitkin, its officials, employees and agents from any and all liability, loss or damage, that the County of Aitkin, its officials, employees and agents may suffer as a result of claims, demands, costs of judgments, including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees arising out of the provision of professional services by Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., as the Medical Examiner of Aitkin County pursuant to Minnesota Statutes Ch. 390, provided, however, that this indemnification shall be limited to the extent of such claims, demands, costs or judgments, including, without limitation, reasonable attorney's fees are covered by insurance.
- B. The County of Aitkin agrees to indemnify and hold harmless River Valley Forensic Services, P.A., Dr. Kelly Mills, M.D., its and their agents, officers or employees from any and all liability, loss or damage, it, he, its agents, officers or employees may suffer as a result of claims, demands, costs or judgments, including without limitation reasonable attorney's fees, arising from the Medical Examiner's or his agents' performance of his or their duties under this Agreement.
- C. River Valley Forensic Services, P.A. shall obtain and keep in effect the following insurance coverage:
 - 1) Comprehensive General Liability Insurance:
 - (a) Minimum Combined Single Limit \$2,000,000 per occurrence \$4,000,000 aggregate
 - (a) The following coverage must be specifically insured and certified with no internal sublimits.

- 1. Independent Contractors' Contingent Liability
- 2. Products/Completed Operations Liability
- 3. Contractual Liability
- 4. Personal Injury Liability including claims related to employment and coverage (a) through (e).
- 5. Broad Form Property Damage Liability, or deletion of the "Care, Custody and Control" Exclusion
- 6. Aircraft Liability (if applicable)
- 7. Watercraft Liability (if applicable)
- (b) The Contractual Liability is to be either on a blanket basis for all written and oral contracts or specifically endorsed to acknowledge the contract between the insured and the County.
- 2. Professional Liability Insurance

Minimum Limits \$2,000,000 per occurrence \$4,000,000 aggregate

- 3. Automobile Liability Insurance on Vehicles Owned by River Valley Forensic Services, P.A., or Kelly Mills, M.D., Kirstin Howell, M.D., Victor Froloff, M.D., or Butch Huston, M.D.
- D. All certificates of insurance shall provide that the insurance company shall give the County thirty (30) days prior written notice of cancellation, non-renewal or any material changes in the policy.
- E. The above subparagraphs establish the minimum insurance requirements, and it is the sole responsibility of River Valley Forensic Services, P.A.. to purchase and maintain additional insurance that may be necessary in connection with this contract.
- F. The Medical Examiner shall provide a certificate of insurance to the County in a form acceptable to Aitkin County. All insurance policies shall be submitted to the County upon written request.
- G. Nothing in this contract shall constitute a waiver by the County of any statutory limits or exceptions on liability.

VII. Transportation

A. Transportation of the deceased bodies from Aitkin County to the Ramsey County Morgue shall be the responsibility of Aitkin County.

VIII. Miscellaneous Provisions

- A. The Medical Examiner and all the members of the Medical Staff must be licensed to practice in Minnesota, with the Medical Examiner holding certification by the American Board of Pathology.
- B. At the termination of this Agreement, the Medical Examiner shall return all files, records and objects related to cases completed, or in progress, to the County upon written request.

IX. Term and Termination

- A. This agreement shall continue for a period ending 12/31/2027 unless terminated sooner pursuant hereto.
- B. This Agreement may be terminated by either party on forty-five (45) days written notice to the other.
- C. This Agreement may be renewed on an annual basis upon agreement of both parties.

X. Entire Agreement, Modification

- A. It is understood and agreed that the entire Agreement of the parties is contained herein, and that this Agreement supersedes all oral agreements and negotiations between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof, as well as any previous Agreements presently in effect between the parties relating to the subject matter hereof.
- B. This Agreement shall be altered, varied, modified or amended only in writing duly executed by the parties and attached hereto.

Subject: Aitkin County HRA Update

The Aitkin County Housing and Redevelopment Authority (HRA) continues to focus on managing and maintaining its housing programs and properties with positive results. Recent and upcoming capital improvements, funded through HUD's Capital Fund Program (CFP) and Minnesota Housing's Publicly Owned Housing Program (POHP), demonstrate steady progress in preserving housing stock and supporting local communities.

Since 2020, the HRA has applied for and been awarded a total of \$2,041,000 through Minnesota Housing's POHP requests for proposals (RFPs) as follows:

- In 2020, the HRA received \$561,700 for upgrades to the fire alarm systems and installation of ADA-compliant entrances at Hill Lake Manor in Hill City and Pioneer Villa in McGregor. The HRA leveraged CFP funds in the amount of \$267,989 toward these projects which were completed in 2024.
- In 2024, the HRA received funding in the amount of \$1,247,180 for boiler replacements at Hill Lake Manor, Pioneer Villa, and Maryhill Manor in Aitkin. The HRA leveraged CFP funds in the amount of \$311,798 toward these projects. These projects are currently in construction and should be completed before the end of the month.
- Each of these projects used local contractors, bringing valuable investment and jobs into Aitkin County communities.
- In 2025, the HRA was awarded \$232,100 to replace the roofs of their 13 family homes in McGregor. In addition, the HRA has leveraged 6% of the total cost of the project from our CFP funds to complete the project. The roof replacement project is scheduled to begin in 2026, with work completed by local contractors. The upgrades will not only improve the safety and comfort of the homes but also reduce maintenance costs and extend the lifespan of these essential community assets.

The POHP program provides competitive, zero-percent deferred loans to public housing authorities across Minnesota, specifically for the rehabilitation and preservation of publicly owned housing. The funds awarded to the Aitkin County HRA will directly support the long-term health of local housing infrastructure.

These awards represent the State of Minnesota's commitment to maintaining affordable housing in Greater Minnesota. Investing in Aitkin County means investing in the future of our residents and our communities.

Project Selection Process

Identified improvements fall into one of five construction categories. Those categories, listed in priority order are as follows.

- 1. Highway Safety Improvement Program
- 2. Bridge Replacement
- 3. Pavement Resurfacing/Shoulder Widening
- 4. Gravel Road Reconstruction to Paved Road Standards
- 4. Gravel Road Improvement

1. Highway Safety Improvement Program

Safety Improvements are selected based on the Aitkin County Highway Safety Plan and available HSIP funding.

2. Bridge Replacement

Bridge replacement projects are selected based on calculated condition ratings that are the result of bridge safety inspections conducted on each bridge under the County's jurisdiction. See attached listing of all local highway bridges in Aitkin County. Highlighted bridges on the attachment are included in the current 5-year capital improvement program.

3. Pavement Resurfacing/Shoulder Widening

Pavement resurfacing projects are selected based on pavement condition data collected on a two-year frequency. In addition, observed pavement conditions and geographical grouping of projects for lower construction costs are considered when scheduling resurfacing projects. See attached listing of all Aitkin County pavement segments. Highlighted segments on the attachment are included in the current 5-year capital improvement program.

The specific type of pavement resurfacing project is determined during the design stage of the project based on the project's individual characteristics. Chipseal, overlay, mill and overlay, reclaim and pave, and cold in-place recycle are included in this construction category.

For segments that have deficient shoulder width, slopes, or culverts, additional work to correct these deficiencies may be added to the resurfacing project.

4. Gravel Road Reconstruction to Paved Road Standards

Improvements of existing gravel-surfaced roads to paved road standards are selected based on a prioritization worksheet that ranks the various gravel road segments based on annual average daily traffic (AADT) count, residence density, functional classification, sight distance deficiencies, improved route system layout, and private land ownership. The resulting priority ratings are updated with each Capital Road Improvement Plan update. See attached priority rating worksheet. Highlighted segments on the attachment are included in the current 5-year capital improvement program.

5. Gravel Road Improvement

Improvements to existing gravel-surfaced roads to gravel road standards are selected based on observed deficiencies of gravel road segments.

System-Wide Safety Strategies

Rural Intersection Lighting

- Provide lighting for intersections that meet traffic count thresholds
- 19 intersections meet criteria and have lighting installed

2. Chevron Signing Improvements

- Provide chevron signage for curves on improved highways that meet criteria
- 160 curves meet criteria and have signs installed

Enhanced Pavement Lane Markings

- Provide 6" ground-in wet reflective edge line and 6" centerline marking on segments that meet criteria
- 131 miles meet criteria, 104 miles have enhanced lane markings installed

4. Intersection Pavement Markings


- Provide Stop Ahead message and stop bar for intersections that meet traffic count thresholds
- 11 intersections meet criteria and have markings installed




Current Pavement Age Graph

We are pleased to present your community with copies of the Preliminary Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) and Flood Insurance Study (FIS) report for Aitkin County, Minnesota and Incorporated Areas for your review and comment. We have produced the FIRM and FIS report in a countywide format, which means that flooding information for the entire county, including Aitkin County Unincorporated Areas and all other incorporated areas, is also shown.

FEMA has prepared a preliminary version of the FIRM using a process that captures digital flood hazard information and plots it on map panels using computer technology. In so doing, we have incorporated non-revised flood hazard information from all current effective FIRMs, Flood Hazard Boundary Maps, and Flood Boundary and Floodway Maps as appropriate.

To give your community an opportunity to review them FEMA has posted digital copies of the FIRM and FIS report materials to the following website:

We will contact you shortly to schedule a formal community coordination meeting (a "Consultation Coordination Officer [CCO]" meeting) to discuss the revised flood hazard information, ordinance adoption, and other frequently asked questions and concerns. In the meantime, we encourage you to circulate the website address as widely as possible among elected officials, staff, and other individuals or organizations in the community that would have an interest in the FIRM and FIS report so that they will have the opportunity to review them before the formal community coordination meeting. The review period provides community officials and citizens in the affected communities with an opportunity to identify changes or corrections to non-technical information, such as corporate limits, road names, and stream names on the FIRM or in the FIS report. Please submit comments (digital format such as shapefiles preferred) no later than 30 days from the date of this letter. All comments and changes received during this review period will be incorporated, as appropriate, before the FIRM and FIS report become effective.

To assist your community in maintaining the FIRM, we have enclosed a Summary of Map Actions (SOMA) to document previous Letters of Map Change (LOMCs) (i.e., Letters of Map Amendment [LOMAs], Letters of Map Revision [LOMRs]) that will be superseded when the FIRM becomes effective. Information on LOMCs is presented in the following four categories: (1) LOMCs for which results have been included on the FIRM; (2) LOMCs for which results could not be shown on the FIRM because of scale limitations or because the LOMC issued had determined that the lots or structures involved were outside the SFHA as shown on the FIRM; (3) LOMCs for which results have not been included on the FIRM because the flood hazard information on which the original determinations were based is being superseded by new flood hazard information; and (4) LOMCs issued for multiple lots or structures where the determination for one or more of the lots or structures cannot be revalidated through an administrative process like the LOMCs in Category 2 above.

LOMCs in Category 2 will be revalidated through a single letter that reaffirms the validity of a previously issued LOMC; the letter will be sent to your community shortly before the effective date of the FIRM and will become effective one day after the FIRM becomes effective.

For the LOMCs listed in Category 4, we will review the data previously submitted for the LOMA or LOMR request and issue a new determination for the affected properties after the FIRM becomes effective upon request.

After the CCO Meeting, we will initiate a statutory 90-day appeal period for certain communities within Aitkin County. A statutory 90-day appeal period is required when FEMA adds or modifies Base (1-percent-annual-chance) Flood Elevations (BFEs), base flood depths, SFHAs, flood zone designations, or regulatory floodways within a community, as shown on the Preliminary FIRM. If your community is identified as requiring an appeal period, we will send you a letter approximately two weeks before the start of the 90-day appeal period to detail the appeal process. The letter will forward information regarding notifications to be published in the FEDERAL REGISTER and local newspaper(s) and will provide the first and second publication dates. The appeal period will start on the second publication date. Additional information concerning the 90-day appeal period will be provided during the CCO Meeting.

After the review and appeal periods have ended and we have addressed all comments/appeals, we will initiate final preparation of the FIRM and FIS report. The new FIRM and FIS report for your community will become effective approximately 7 to 10 months from now. Before the effective date, you will be notified in writing of the official FIRM and FIS report effective date and asked to adopt floodplain ordinances or modify existing ordinances as necessary that correspond with the new FIRM or FIS report. If you or other community officials have any questions about adopting floodplain ordinances, you may contact the FEMA Regional Office or discuss them with your State NFIP Coordinator. Several months before the effective date, we will mail one set of printed copies of the finalized FIRM and FIS report and digital copies of the map and report products.

Your community comments on the Preliminary FIRM panels and FIS report are an important part of our review process, and we will consider them carefully before we publish the FIRM and FIS report in their final form. RE: Public Waters Inventory Corrections Within Aitkin County

Dear Mark Wedel:

In 2024, the Minnesota Legislature enacted Minn. Stat. § 103G.201 (f) which directed the Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to update the state's Public Water Inventory (PWI) by correcting errors in the original inventory; adding or subtracting trout stream tributaries; adding depleted quarries, and sand and gravel pits; and adding or subtracting public waters that have been created or eliminated as a DNR permit requirement. The DNR will update the inventory on a county-by-county basis. We are now beginning this work in Aitkin County.

What are public waters and the PWI?

Public waters are defined by Minn. Stat. § 103G.005, subd. 15 and include meandered lakes, water basins, altered and unaltered water courses, and public waters wetlands. The state holds title to its public waters and lands thereunder as a trustee for the people for public use. The DNR is responsible for regulating activities in these waters to protect the public's interest.

Although the statutory definition of public waters controls a water's classification as public, the PWI is a tool used to help identify public waters in Minnesota. County PWI lists and maps (which together constitute the PWI) were first created by the DNR in the 1980s and the PWI remains a reliable and robust tool in protecting water resources across the state.

Summary of the original PWI stakeholder process

The creation of the PWI was a rigorous and robust process that involved the development of a preliminary list and map of all public waters in each county (preliminary PWI). This list was submitted to the county, after which the county held public informational meetings to elicit feedback on the proposed PWI. DNR reviewed all comments forwarded by the county on the draft PWI, adjusted the preliminary inventory, and published notice of the revised PWI list and maps in each county.

The notice invited anyone challenging a designation to "list the reason(s) why the particular public water or wetland does not meet the statutory definition" of a public water. These objections were heard in a hearing similar in nature to a contested-case hearing. The hearing panel was required to issue findings of fact and conclusions of law which were then used by the DNR to finalize the PWI for the county. The decisions issued by the three-judge panel were appealable to the Commissioner and ultimately to the appellate court. Given the rigors of this process, it is not DNR's intent to reopen the PWI in each county.

The PWI Update stakeholder process

The DNR will use the original PWI stakeholder process to update and correct the original PWI as directed by the new legislation. DNR will undertake this work on a county-by-county basis. The process that the DNR will use is:

- Prepare a preliminary map reflecting the proposed corrections and any modifications and submit it to the county board. Potentially affected landowners will receive direct mail notice.
- Host a public meeting, in conjunction with a county board meeting, to elicit public feedback on the
 preliminary revisions to the map. Public meeting details, including date and location, will be provided in
 the preliminary map notice sent to all parties. After the public meeting, the DNR will provide a 30-day
 comment period on the corrections and modifications made in the preliminary map.
- Review the feedback received during the comment period and make necessary modification to the
 preliminary map. This revised map, now a provisional final map, will be submitted to the county and
 made available on the DNR's project webpage.
- Provide 90 days for parties (including riparian landowners) or counties wishing to challenge a decision
 made by the DNR to request DNR Commissioner's Review of the modified and updated PWI. This
 request must be accompanied by a submission form provided by DNR. The form requires a challenge to
 include technical rationale of statutory definition(s) not met; comprehensive supporting maps and
 imagery; and, if warranted, evidence from the original PWI review process. Commissioner's Review
 requests that do not include a submission form and required materials will be denied.
- Issue the updated PWI list and map for the county, upon completion of Commissioner's Review process.

Past decisions, including those tied to the original PWI effort and subsequent final agency actions, will remain in place and are not subject to challenge. The PWI Update Project is not a stakeholder opportunity to re-make past PWI decisions.

Examples of known PWI errors and corrections

The PWI Update Project addresses known errors identified by the DNR. The project is a targeted effort and is not a re-inventory of the state's public waters. Examples of corrections and revisions the DNR has identified statewide include:

- Designated trout streams and trout stream tributaries that are not identified on the PWI.
- Watercourses that qualify as a public water but were removed from the PWI in 2017 by Commissioner's
 Order due to errors found during the 2016 Buffer Protection Map initiative.
- Existing public water wetlands that clearly did not conform to statutory criteria for size (estimated area).
- County boundary corrections.

In addition to the example corrections above, DNR Area Hydrologists will inform the PWI Update Project of case-by-case potential corrections when their assigned county is under review.

The following is not considered to be an "error in the original inventory":

Areas initially proposed on the preliminary inventory that were subsequently removed by the DNR as
part of the public information meeting process or dropped from or remained on the PWI as part of the
petition, hearing, and appeal process.

How does this impact landowners in this county?

The updated PWI will provide a better tool for water resource protection, regulatory clarity and a shared understanding of where public waters are located on the landscape. The PWI Update Project will likely result in adding or removing some waters from the inventory. Landowners adjacent to added public waters will be subject to the State Buffer Law.

Frequently Asked Questions – Public Waters Inventory Update

What is the PWI Update Project?

Public waters are defined in statute and include lakes, wetlands and watercourses of certain sizes and characteristics. A 2024 statute revision clarified that public waters are not determined by their inclusion in or exclusion from the Public Waters Inventory (PWI). However, because the PWI is such an important tool, the DNR has been directed to update the PWI.

The PWI Update process will proceed with a goal of averaging 12 counties a year, concluding by 2032. The update effort will be organized with review of four counties at a time, distributed across DNR's four administrative regions.

Is the PWI being completely rebuilt?

No. The PWI Update Project is a targeted effort and is not a re-inventory of the state's public waters. Statewide, the Project's baseline review areas are:

- Designated trout stream tributaries to be added.
- Watercourses that qualify as a public water but were removed from the PWI in 2017 by Commissioner's Order due to errors found during the Buffer Protection Map project.
- Public water wetlands that clearly did not conform to statutory criteria for size.

During the county review process, DNR Area Hydrologists may inform the project of case-by-case potential corrections in addition to the baseline data. However, past decisions, including those tied to the original PWI effort and subsequent final agency actions, will remain in place and are not subject to review.

When will the PWI Update occur in my county?

Counties will be updated on a quasi-alphabetic basis with adjustment as needed to defer areas with intricate topics such as ongoing trout stream designations.

Counties will be notified by letter prior to the work commencing. The project webpage and email notification will be used for updates and to display county status statewide.

How will the PWI Update Project proceed?

The DNR has assembled a team of hydrologists to use the best available technology, within the time constraints of the project, to conduct technical analysis of needed PWI corrections.

A diagram illustrating the process is available on the project website. A general outline of the process is as follows:

- The DNR will send a notification letter to a county and begin technical review.
- The DNR will prepare a map of preliminary corrections with opportunity for review, questions and comments.
- Potentially affected landowners will receive direct mail notice of the preliminary map.
- A public meeting will be held in each county, with notice of the meeting provided via GovDelivery email.
- Any comments received will be considered prior to finalization of PWI corrections for that county.
- Parties wishing to challenge a decision made by the DNR will have an opportunity to request a Commissioner's Review.
- A final map and list will be published.

Will landowners and others have opportunities for input and feedback?

Yes. As preliminary corrections are provided for each county, there will be opportunity for review, questions and comments. Any comments received

will be considered prior to finalization of PWI corrections for that county.

What types of feedback are being sought?

The DNR will receive public comments on the PWI update preliminary map through a web-based tool accessible through the project website (mndnr.gov/pwi-update).

Useful feedback will be specific to proposed corrections shown on the preliminary map and related statutory definitions of public waters. Feedback not sought by the DNR includes refinements to digital line placement or public water name adjustment. Those data management activities are not a statutory definition error and are not part of the PWI Update scope of work.

Feedback on Buffer Law requirements for any new public waters will be accepted only after the finalization of a county's updated map.

When is the comment period?

The stakeholder outreach phase begins when the DNR publishes the preliminary map of proposed corrections for a county. The comment period will close thirty days after the public meeting is held.

How will the preliminary map be distributed?

The preliminary map of proposed corrections will be available for viewing on an interactive webbased tool accessible through the project website (mndnr.gov/pwi-update). Additionally, static PDF versions of the preliminary map will be created.

The DNR will announce the preliminary map along with details of the public meeting via multiple channels.

- Emails and printed mail will be sent to a county board, county administrator, SWCD, and Tribal governments as applicable.
- Potentially affected landowners will receive printed mail. Notice will be published in the county newspaper of record.
- GovDelivery subscribers will receive a notification. A link to sign up for

GovDelivery updates is available on the project webpage (mndnr.gov/pwi-update).

What is the Commissioner's Review process?

The DNR will review the feedback received during the comment period and make necessary modification to the preliminary map. This revised map, now a provisional final map, will be submitted to the county and made available on the project webpage. Parties wishing to challenge a decision made by the DNR will have 90 days to request a Commissioner's Review of the modified and updated PWI. This request must be accompanied by a submission form provided by the DNR and all required evidentiary materials.

How does the PWI Update Project relate to Minnesota's existing Buffer Law?

Minnesota's Buffer Law requires perennial vegetation buffers of up to 50 feet along rivers, streams and ditches that help filter out phosphorus, nitrogen and sediment.

The DNR's role in Minnesota's buffer law is to produce and maintain a map of public waters and public ditch systems that require permanent vegetation buffers.

The PWI Update may change the buffer requirements on some public waters subject to corrections. Any waterbody added to the PWI will be subject to applicable buffer requirements. The update to the buffer map would occur after the PWI updates in a county are finalized.

How will the PWI Update Project affect local requirements such as shoreland ordinances?

The project will not change shoreland regulations on existing public waters on the PWI. Any waterbody added to the PWI will not automatically have a shoreland classification. 





